AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 13th day of June, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising all the lands and premises in the parish of St. Thomas, in the city of Oxford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the west by the Great Western Railway, including such Railway, on the north by the Botley-road and Park End-street, including such roads, and on the east and south by the easternmost stream running from Pacey's Bridge to where it joins the river.

ARTICLE II. The said Guardians may, in addition to the said Parochial List and Statement of Account, cause such further information as aforesaid to be printed and circulated among the Rate-payers of the said Union, or to be advertised in some newspaper or newspapers circulated within the said Union.

ARTICLE III. The reasonable costs incurred under this Order by the said Guardians shall be charged to the Common Fund of the said Union.

NORTH SEA—JUTLAND.—WEST COAST.

Particulars of Intended Light on Blaavand Point.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 265 of 16th November, 1886, and previous notice, on the intended exhibition of a provisional light from the beacon on Blaavand Point and intended permanent light:—

The Danish Government has given further notice, that the permanent light will be exhibited during the autumn of the year 1887.

The light will be an occulting white light, elevated 91 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles. It will be visible between the bearings of S. 32° W., through south, and N. 36° W., thus:—

Between the bearings from N. 36° W. to N. 20° W., from N. 35° E. to N. 59° E., from N. 80° E. to S. 71° E., and from S. 21° W. to S. 32° W., the light will be visible for periods of three and one third seconds' duration, separated by eclipses of one second, every sixth eclipse being lengthened to a duration of five seconds. Between the bearings from N. 20° W. to N. 35° E.; from N. 59° E. to N. 80° E., and from S. 71° E. to S. 21° W., the light will be visible for periods of twenty-five seconds, separated by eclipses of five seconds.

(The bearings are magnetic, and are given from seaward. Variation 14° Westerly in 1887.)

BALTIC ENTRANCE.

(1.) *Kiel Fiord—Buoys Marking Submarine Mining Ground.*

THE German Government has given notice, that from 27th June to 22nd August, 1887, exercises with submarine mines will be proceeded with in the north-western portion of Kiel Fiord:—

Vessels are prohibited from either navigating in, or anchoring over, the area set apart for the above-mentioned exercises.

The area is marked as follows:—

On the north and west—By the west shore of Kiel Fiord.

On the south and east—By six buoys, each with staff and red flag.

The eastern boundary of the mine field is a line joining the barracks at Friedrichsort and the Hotel Bellevue, in the wood at Düsternbrok.

The southern boundary is north of Eider Canal Entrance.

NOTE.—It is probable that exercises with large mines will also take place in the entrance to Kiel Fiord. Directions for entering should be obtained from vessels stationed for the purpose.

GULF OF BOTHNIA—COAST OF FINLAND.

(2.) *Alteration in Colour of Kaskö Lighthouse.*
