A PROCLAMATION

FOR EXTENDING PARDONS TO SOLDIERS WHO MAY HAVE DESERTED FROM OUR LAND FORCES.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS We are desirous to mark the completion of the fiftieth year of Our reign by extending Our Pardon to soldiers who may have deserted from Our Land Forces previously to the issuing of this Our Royal Proclamation, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby accordingly grant Our Most Gracious pardon to all men who having, before the date of this Proclamation, deserted or absented themselves without leave from Our Regular Forces, Militia, or Reserve Forces, or having fraudulently enlisted within the meaning of Section 13 of the Army Act, or having while in the Army Reserve irregularly enlisted in Our Regular Forces or Militia, shall report themselves within two months

from the date of this Proclamation, if residing in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man, or within four months therefrom, if residing elsewhere; and We do hereby declare that such men shall, on so reporting themselves, be released and discharged from all prosecutions, imprisonments, and penalties, other than loss of service, pay, deferred pay, or pension, commenced or incurred by reason of such offences; and We do further declare that all such men who enlisted before the 21st June, 1877, or who have been in a state of desertion or absence without leave for a period exceeding five years, or who may be physically unfit for military service, will not be called upon to rejoin for service, but will be granted protecting certificates on their so reporting themselves.

The men to whom this Our Proclamation applies are not to report themselves in person, but are to do so by letter, giving full particulars by which they can be identified, and if they are suffering from physical disability rendering them unable to rejoin the Service, they are to state the same clearly.

And We do hereby make further declaration that every offender herein referred to who shall not avail himself of the Pardon We now graciously offer, shall be held amenable to all pains and penalties provided under the Army Act, the Militia Act, or Reserve Forces Act, as the case may be.

A PROCLAMATION,
For a Public Holiday.

VICTORIA, R.

WE, considering that Tuesday, the twenty-first day of June next, has been, by Our Royal Proclamation, dated the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, commanded to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, and considering that it is desirable that the said day should be observed as a Public Holiday in the Customs, Inland Revenue Offices, and Bonding Warehouses in England and Ireland respectively, pursuant to the Holidays Extension Act, 1875; and considering that it is desirable that the said day should be kept as a Public Holiday by the Customs, pursuant to the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, within the jurisdiction of the Commissioners of Customs appointed pursuant to the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876; and also that the said day should be kept as a Public Holiday by the Officers and Servants of the Dock Companies in England and Ireland, as required by the Holidays Extension Act, 1875; do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, and each and every of them, and of every other power enabling us in that behalf, appoint and direct Tuesday, the twenty-first day of June next to be, and to be kept as a Public Holiday as aforesaid. And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so kept, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 18th day of June, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the property of Leuchars Lodge, in the parish of Leuchars, occupied by Major John L. Fraser; William Keny, farmer; and Thomas Kempie, mason; in the county of Fife,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

CHINA SEA.—PULO CONDORE GROUP.

Fixed Light on Haon Bai Kan Island.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 197 of 22nd October, 1884, on the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse in course of construction on the eastern point of Haon Bai Kan Island, Pulo Condore Group:—

The French Government has given further notice, that the light will be exhibited on the 1st July, 1887.

The light will be a fixed white light, visible through an arc of 268°, or between the bearings of N. 62° E., through west, and S. 26° except where obscured by Haon Cao Islet through a sector of 7°, or from S. 48° W. to S. 55° W.

From a distance, the light will be visible over the extremes of Pulo Condore, beyond the limits given above.

It is elevated 696 feet above the sea and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 27 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the first order.
Position, lat. 8° 40' 5" N., long. 106° 41' 40" E.

NEW ZEALAND.—MIDDLE ISLAND

(1.) *French Pass—Alteration in Channel Point Light.*

THE Government of New Zealand has given notice, that on 16th May, 1887, the following alteration would be made in the light exhibited on Channel Point, south shore of French Pass, between Admiralty Bay and Current Basin, north coast of Middle Island:—

The light is a fixed white and red light, showing white over the Piego Rocks or between D'Urville Island and the bearing of N.E. ½ N., and red from that bearing to the mainland. In all other directions the light is unaltered.

(2.) Otago Harbour—Mooring Buoys in Entrance.

Also, has given notice, dated 12th April, 1887, that the dredger's mooring buoys in Otago Harbour Entrance, having been shifted $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables further seaward, are now situated outside Tairoa Head and nearly in line with the leading beacons:—

(1.) Character and Visibility of Maternillos Point Light.

INFORMATION has been received, that the interval between the flashes of Maternillos Point Light (fixed and flashing white) is forty-eight seconds, the duration of the flash being five seconds. The light should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 17 miles.

MEDITERRANEAN.—ADRIATIC—WEST SHORE.
Ancona—Intend d Alterations in Character and Colour of Light on North Mole.

INFORMATION has been received from H.B.M. Vice-Consul at Ancona, that early in the month of July, 1887, the following alterations will be made in the character and colour of the light on the North Mole at that place:—

The light will be an occulting white light showing flashes of ten seconds' duration, separated by eclipses of five seconds. It will be elevated 34 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be of the fifth order.

The lighthouse is constructed of masonry.

RED SEA—EAST SHORE.

Reported Sunken Rock Northward of Jebel Zukur Island.

TELEGRAPHIC information has been received from the Resident at Aden, that the steam-vessel "Teddington" has sunk on a hidden danger, 5 miles E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from the reported position of the Avocet Rock:—

This places the danger in lat. $14^{\circ} 23' N.$, long. $42^{\circ} 42' 30'' E.$

Pending further information, Mariners are warned to pass to the westward of a line joining Centre Peak Island, Zubayir Islands, and High Island, Jebel Zukur.

NOTE.—An examination, made in April last, by Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Flying Fish," of the vicinity of the rock reported by the "Avocet," failed to show any sign of shoal water. The position of the danger now reported, falls at the outer limit of the area of this examination.

Staines Union.—Parish of Sunbury.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Staines Union, in the County of Middlesex;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Sunbury, in the County of Middlesex;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the said parish of Sunbury, according to the last Census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, pursuant to public notice in that

behalf, on Thursday, the 12th day of May, 1887, it was resolved,—

- “ That the Local Government Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled ‘An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry and other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,’ shall be applied to and put in force within this Parish as regards that portion of the Act which relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk.”
- “ That the duties to be assigned to such Vestry Clerk be those defined in section 7 of the above-mentioned Act, with the exception of the duties comprised in the clause thereof which relates to making out the Poor Rate, the clause relating to issuing the necessary process for recovering of arrears of such rates, and the clause relating to making out the list of persons liable to serve on juries.”
- “ That the salary to be paid such Vestry Clerk be 50*l.* per annum.
- “ That the security to be given by such Vestry Clerk be 100*l.*”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made application in writing to us, the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above Resolution:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, we hereby declare and order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Sunbury, and the provisions contained in Articles II., III., and IV., of this Order shall apply to the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed for that Parish.

ARTICLE II.—The duties to be performed by the Vestry Clerk shall be those mentioned in Section 7 of the said Act, except those referred to in the hereinbefore recited Resolution.

ARTICLE III.—The Vestry Clerk shall give to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Staines Union a bond, in a penal sum of not less than one hundred pounds, in the names of himself and one sufficient surety, not being an officer of that Union, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and shall give immediate notice to the said Guardians of the death or bankruptcy of such surety, or of his having compounded with his creditors or liquidated his affairs by arrangement, and shall, when required by the said Guardians, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his surety is alive and is believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die or become bankrupt, or who may have compounded with his creditors or liquidated his affairs as aforesaid.

Provided that the Guardians may accept as a security the guarantee of any Company or Association, which shall undertake to guarantee the good conduct of such officer, and shall give their guarantee in a security, the form whereof shall have been approved by the Poor Law Board or the Local Government Board under their Seal.

ARTICLE IV.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish shall pay to the Vestry Clerk a salary at the rate of fifty pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the per-

formance of the duties of that office as we may, with the consent of such person, from time to time direct.

ARTICLE V.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of “The Apportionment Act, 1870,” and shall be paid quarterly on the usual quarter days in each year, namely, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, and Lady Day.

ARTICLE VI.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish.
