Address of the Royal Dublin Society to Her Most Gracious Majesty VICTORIA, QUEEN of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

*May it please Your Majesty,*

ON behalf of the Royal Dublin Society, of which Your Majesty is the Patron, we, the President, Vice-President, and Council of the Society express our sincere and hearty congratulations to Your Majesty upon the occasion of this the Jubilee Year of Your auspicious Reign.

We take this opportunity of expressing our unswerving attachment to Your Throne and Person, and our hope that Your Majesty may long be spared to reign over the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that greater British Empire of which we are proud to form a part.

For more than a hundred and fifty years we have laboured in Ireland for the advancement of Agriculture, Industry, Art, and Science, and at no period have our efforts been more successful than during the fifty years of Your Majesty's Reign. Much of the work that we initiated has grown to be of such national importance that Your Majesty's Government has undertaken it in order that it might be carried forward on a sufficient scale. The Geological Survey of Ireland, the Botanic Gardens of Glasnevin, the National Museum of Science and Art, the Metropolitan School of Art, and the National Library of Ireland are monuments of the good work initiated by the Royal Dublin Society. Notwithstanding that we have lost these and other fields of labour, we were never more occupied with our work than at present. Our scientific transactions and proceedings are of established reputation, and are exchanged with all the important Scientific Societies of the world for copies of their own publications. In Art we are successfully cultivating an important branch of instrumental music. In Industry we are celebrating this Jubilee Year of Your Majesty's reign by an extensive and most successful Exhibition of Irish Manufactures at the Royal Jubilee Exhibition in Manchester. We feel sure that this Exhibition will advance Irish industries by acquainting all the world with Irish Manufactures. In Agriculture our labours have been most extensive and successful. Our agricultural shows, which we began to hold shortly before the commencement of Your Majesty's reign, are now some of the largest and most renowned in Your Dominions, and Your Majesty's Government have recently shown their appreciation of our work and their confidence in us by expressing their intention of asking Parliament to give us the means of further improving the breeds of horses and cattle in Ireland. We hope to merit a continuance of this confidence and an extension of it that will enable us to advance other industries, such as the Fisheries, by disseminating throughout Ireland information as to the best methods and education in the application of these methods.

As was so ably and energetically advocated by His Royal Highness the late Prince Consort, whose statue was erected in our lawn, and whose

memory we venerate, we feel confident that it is from a wise co-operation of Science, Art, and Industry that we must look for all improvements in material prosperity, and that any separation of this triple bond must seriously impare the prospects of obtaining the best results. By this triple co-operation the Royal Dublin Society has in the past achieved its greatest successes, and by it we hope to accomplish still more in the future, for we feel confident that in union with England we may confidently expect that environment of peace due to the supremacy of good laws, without which all our efforts would be useless, and which has hitherto been such a distinguishing characteristic of the wonderful half-century during which Your Majesty has so gloriously reigned over the British Empire.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—around the farm called Whitehall Farm, situate in the parish of Egham, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the west the road leading from Callow Hill to Upper Bakeham House, on the north the road and footpath from Upper Bakeham House to Luddington House, on the east the road from Luddington House to Stroude Farm, and on the south the footpath and road leading from Stroude Farm to Callow Hill; the said roads and footpaths forming the boundaries of the said Area being included in the Area,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the seventeenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 21st ultimo, from Her Majesty's Representative at Thérapia, enclosing the following translation of a Rule established by the Board of Health, applicable to vessels arriving in a Turkish port from a place subject to quarantine after having called and received pratique at an intermediate healthy port:—

Constantinople, 30th June.

DURING the present period of quarantine, and until further orders, Sanitary Offices having a doctor are authorized after the essential medical visit to admit to free pratique:—

(1.) Vessels which arrive in a port of the Ottoman coast having a sanitary doctor, fifteen days after having left a country, the direct arrivals from which are subject to the rule of five days' quarantine. If this term of fifteen days should not have been completed, the vessels will remain in quarantine until its completion.

(2.) Vessels which arrive in a port of the Ottoman coast having a sanitary doctor, twenty-four days after they have left a country, the direct arrivals from which are subject to the rule of ten days' quarantine. If this term of twenty-four days should not have been completed the vessels shall remain in quarantine until its completion.

It is understood that in either case vessels under these conditions cannot take advantage of this rule unless they are furnished with clean bills of health obtained during their voyage in a clean port after their departure from the infected country, and unless in addition the sanitary conditions of the vessel are found to be good on medical inspection.

Further and always during the present period of quarantine, captains who arrive in a port of the Ottoman coast must give, at the Sanitary Offices, all particulars which may be there asked of them relative to the last port indicated on their bill of health, as well as regards the places where their vessels may have touched previously to their departure from such last port. In the absence of documents in support of the bill of health, or other papers concerning their voyage from previous ports, the captains must make a deposition in writing and signed at the Sanitary Office. In case of refusal on the part of the captain to comply with these formalities, his ship will be put under suspicion, and as such will be subjected to quarantine measures.

It is besides equally understood that quarantine purged in a foreign port after the departure of a vessel from an infected port will count in Ottoman ports where there is a doctor in deduction from that imposed by our rules at the time in force.

The present circular will relieve the administration from repeating the instructions for its application in any circular telegrams prescribing the enforcement of the rule of five days, or of

that of ten days, against direct arrivals from country which is infected or deemed to be so.

Rye Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Rye Union, in the counties of Sussex and Kent;—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order, dated the 11th day of May, 1885, We, the Local Government Board, empowered the Guardians of the Poor of the said Rye Union to appoint a competent person or persons as a Stocktaker or Stocktakers at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union to perform the duties therein set forth;

And whereas by Article V of the said Order it is provided that the Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, examine the stores at the Workhouse, and compare the same with the entries in the Accounts referred to in such Article;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Article V should be altered as hereinafter mentioned;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby rescind the said Article V in the said General Order dated the eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and Direct that the following Article shall be substituted in its place; namely,—

"ARTICLE V.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each half-



“ year, and at any other time when required by  
 “ the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at  
 “ the Workhouse and compare the same with the  
 “ quantities of stock remaining in store as shown  
 “ by the entries in the proper columns in the  
 “ Accounts termed respectively the ‘Quarterly  
 “ ‘Balance of the Provisions Account’ and the  
 “ ‘Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and  
 “ ‘Miscellaneous Account.’”

“ He shall also, on the day next after the ter-  
 “ mination of each half-year, and at any other  
 “ time when required by the Guardians to do so,  
 “ examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse  
 “ and compare the same with the balance appear-  
 “ ing in the Accounts termed respectively the  
 “ ‘Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion

Cannock Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Cannock  
 Union, in the county of Stafford:—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the  
 Poor of the several Parishes, and to the  
 Overseers of the Poor of the several Town-  
 ships and of the Chapelry comprised in the  
 said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pur-  
 suance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes  
 in that behalf, hereby Order, with respect to the  
 relief of the Poor in the said Cannock Union, as  
 follows:—

ARTICLE 1.—Subject to the provisions of the  
 General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners,  
 dated the twenty-first day of December, one  
 thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in force  
 in the Union, every able-bodied male pauper who  
 receives relief within the Union, and is relieved  
 out of the Workhouse, shall be relieved in the  
 following manner; that is to say:—

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper  
 shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles  
 of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the  
 Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Over-  
 seer of any Parish or Place in the Union, while  
 he is employed for wages or other hire or remu-  
 neration by any person; but every such pauper so  
 relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2.—The Guardians shall, within  
 fourteen days after the day when this Order  
 comes into force, and from time to time after-  
 wards as the Local Government Board may  
 require, report to the Local Government Board  
 the place or places at which able-bodied male  
 paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the  
 sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them  
 shall be employed, the times and mode of work,  
 and all such other matters relating to the employ-  
 ment of such able-bodied paupers as the said  
 Guardians shall deem material to be communicated  
 to the Local Government Board, or as the Local  
 Government Board shall require.

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ARTICLE 3.—If the Guardians shall depart, in  
 any particular instance, from any of the regula-  
 tions hereinbefore contained, and shall, within  
 fifteen days after such departure, report the same  
 and the grounds thereof to the Local Government  
 Board, and if the Local Government Board shall  
 approve of such departure, then the relief granted  
 in such particular instance shall, if otherwise  
 lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject  
 to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General  
 Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing  
 date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand  
 eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said  
 Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be  
 termed a Superintendent of Out-door Labour, and  
 for the continuance in office of such officer, and  
 it is expedient that further provision should be  
 made as hereinafter mentioned;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time  
 the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring  
 relief shall be so small as to render the services  
 of a Superintendent of Out-door Labour un-  
 necessary, the Guardians may dispense with the  
 services of such an officer.
