THE following Address was presented to Her Imperial and Royal Highness the Crown Princess of Germany and Princess Royal of Great Britain and Ireland, who, as representing Her Majesty the Queen, laid the stone of a new Church at Portsea, on the 9th instant :--

To Her Imperial and Royal Highness the Crown Princess of Germany and Princess Royal of England.

May it please Your Royal Highness,

WE, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portsmouth, desire most heartily to welcome Your Royal Highness to this borough, and to assure you of the gratification which is folt by its inhabitants at Your visit, for though Your Royal Highness has for some years been more closely identified with a foreign nation, yet as the Princess Royal of England and the Daughter of our Most Gracious Queen, we are sure that the people of England, and none more so than the inhabitants of this ancient borough, rotain the deepest regard for Her Royal Highne-s, and this feeling is, we venture to hope, maintained, and to some extent intensified, by the friendly feeling which exists, and we trust will continue to cxist, between the English and German nations.

The erection of a new church in the midst of a large population cannot well be otherwise than productive of good to that population, and on account of the great improvement in the condition of the people which may result from the extension of religious influence it is an object in which it is known Her Most Gracious Majesty and all the members of the Royal Family take the greatest interest.

That interest is shown by the presence of Your Royal Highness in our borough to-day, and the kindness of Your Royal Highness in laying the foundation stone of the new Church for the parish of Portsea is most sincerely appreciated; and while hoping that the work You begin to-day may be productive of the best results, we beg to assure Your Royal Highness of the pleasure with which Your presence on this occasion will be remembered.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 16th day of August, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Local Authority acting in and for the county of Perth, dated the fourteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be a Place infected with pleuropneumonia (namely), - the farm steading and three fields adjoining the farm steading of Mains of Errol, in the parish of Errol, and county of Perth, including the reeds, byres, cow-sheds, and other buildings situated thereon, occupied by Mr. James Kidd; also the public-road leading from Mains of Errol to Port Allen, in the said parish and county,—are hereby contracted or altered so as to include the Place as described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place so described in the Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order be deemed to be the Place declared by the said order of the Local Authority to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 8th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclosing the following translation of a Decree, respecting the treatment of arrivals from Malta, in the Ports of Italy :-

1887, Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 11.

THE Minister of the Interior, in view of the Law of 20th March, 1865, Appendix C, respecting Public Health, and the Ministerial Instructions of 26th December, 1871;

Having received official information of the appearance of cases of cholera in the Island of Malta ; Decrees :

ART. 1. All vessels arriving from the said Island shall, from to-day, be subjected to a medical examination upon their arrival in the ports of the Kingdom, in order to ascertain the sanitary condition of the persons on board, and to prevent them from introducing into the Kingdom, without previously disinfecting them, any articles of linen or wool, whether for personal or household use, which may not be perfectly clean :

ART. 2. Persons who, at the time of the examination, shall be found by the medical officers to be ill, or who shall be suspected of being so, shall be landed, together with their baggage, in an isolated place, in order that the persons may there be subjected to treatment, and their effects disinfected :

ART. 3. Soiled effects, even though belonging to healthy persons, must be disinfected by keeping them in boiling water for ten minutes, or for one hour in a solution of 2 per 1,000 of corrosive sublimate :

ART. 4. Vessels on board of which cases of

choleraic disease shall be found to have occurred, shall be subjected to the measures of disinfection laid down in Ordinance No. 7, of the 21st of June last:

ART. 5. The importation into the Kingdom of rags or worn clothes, coming from the Island of Malta, is absolutely prohibited until further orders.

The Prefects of seaboard provinces, captains of ports, and harbour masters are charged with the execution of the present Decree.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 11th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna, enclosing the following copy of a Government Circular published by the authorities at the port of Trieste, imposing quarantine on arrivals from Malta :-

In consequence of cholera having manifested itself at Malta, vessels arriving from that island which have sailed after the 2nd instant will be subjected, in Austrian ports, to a quarantine observation of seven days, provided they have had a clean passage and arrive in normal health.

The sanitary treatment of vessels arriving with cases of sickness on board will be decided, from time to time, by the Maritime Board, to whom a report of the case, telegraphic if necessary, is to made.

Vessels having a doctor on board will be allowed to reckon the time of their voyage as a part of the quarantine observation.

Ships subjected to the above measures will be disinfected according to the prescriptions for vessels arriving from cholera infected ports.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 5th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, transmitting the following copy of the Regulations drawn up by the Medical Council, respecting quarantine measures in Bulgaria :

(1.) The entrance into Bulgarian ports of all ships, travellers, and merchandize coming from Sicily and from the coasts of Italy, is prohibited, unless they have submitted to a quarantine of ten days in some Ottoman Port.

(2). Travellers who disembark from vessels which have undergone such quarantine in Ottoman ports, are subjected in Bulgarian ports to a medical inspection.

(3). Ships which are bound direct for Russia are free to pass without undergoing quarantine, but they are prohibited from communicating with our ports.

Under date of the 4th instant, the Minister of Justice issued the following Quarantine Notice :

1. All arrivals from Malta, and all vessels which on their voyage have communicated with ships coming from that Island, are subject to quarantine.

2. The usual prohibition as to the importation of articles, except they form part of passengers' luggage, is to apply to objects coming from Malta.

The quarantine against all other places mentioned in the previous notice, reported in my Despatch No. 39, Commercial, of the 23rd ultimo remains in force.

Sanitary Measures.—Algeria. A Decree of the Governor-General of Algeria, of the 10th instant, subjects on their reaching Algeria, arrivals from Sicily and Pantellaria, as well as those from the coast of Continental Italy, from Cape Circello on the west to Cape Gorgano on the east, to an observation of which the duration is fixed at seven days for steam vessels and five days for sailing vessels.

Nevertheless those of such arrivals which have called in Tunis and have there undergone the quarantine of eight days applied in the Regency are admitted to free pratique on their arrival in Algeria.
