THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under

The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The provisions of Article 73 (*Swine-Fever Infected Circle*) of The Animals Order of 1886 shall apply and extend to and be in force in the District mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall continue to apply and extend to and be in force in that District until the Privy Council by further Special Order direct and order; and the Order of Council dated the sixteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, which applies the said provisions to certain Districts therein named, shall be read and have effect as if the District named in the Schedule to this Order was also named in that Order.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 24th day of September, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) so much of the farm of Forthar, in the parish of Kettle, in the county of Fife, as lies to the south or south-east of the public-road leading from Cupar by Kettle and Muirhead to New Inn, and (2.) Ferry Barns, in the parish of Dunfermline, in the county of Fife, in the occupation of David Adamson,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the tenth day of May, and the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be Areas infected with pleuro-pneumonia, are hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
