THE BRITISH PROTECTORATE OF THE NIGER DISTRICTS.

IT is hereby notified for public information that, under and by virtue of certain Treaties concluded between the month of July, 1884, and the present date, and by other lawful means, the territories in West Africa, hereinafter referred to as the Niger Districts, are under the Protectorate of Her Majesty the Queen.

The British Protectorate of the Niger Districts comprises the territories on the line of coast between the British Protectorate of Lagos and the right or western river bank of the mouth of the Rio del Rey. It further comprises all territories in the basin of the Niger and its affluents, which are or may be for the time being subject to the Government of the National African Government Limited (now called the Royal Niger Company), in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the said Company, dated the 10th July, 1886.

The measures in course of preparation for the administration of justice and the maintenance of peace and good order in the Niger Districts will be duly notified and published.

The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Kirkliston District Committee of the Local Authority for the county of Linlithgow, dated the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—the byre and whole other buildings forming the Farm Steading at Cramond Bridge, in the parish of Dalmeny, and county of Linlithgow, occupied by John Amour, farmer there;—are hereby extended so as to include the Place described in the Schedule to this Order,

and the Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, October 18, 1887.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a Despatch, dated 7th September last, from Her Majesty's Representative at Quito, respecting quarantine observation in Ecuador :-

In consequence of there having been cases of cholera in ports south of Valparaiso, the Fort of Guayaquil is closed for vessels which have touched at the Chilian ports of Tome and Talcabuano later than the 23rd ultimo.

The Sanitary Board of Guayaquil decreed 40 days' quarantine for vessels which had touched at those ports previous to the 13th ultimo, that passengers from the south must be provided with certified passports to the effect that they did not proceed from infected ports, a similar certificate being required for all Chilian cargo. The Governor of Guayaquil, however, resolved not to put these regulations in force.

MEDITERRANEAN SEA—SARDINIA.—EAST COAST.

(1.) Port Terranova—Occulting Light on Islet at
Entrance.

THE Italian Government has given notice, that on 1st October, 1887, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on the islet (della Bocca), south side of Port Terranova Entrance:—

The light is an occulting white light, with red flashes every twenty-five seconds, the duration of the white light is twelve seconds, that of the red flash two seconds, which is preceded and followed by short partial eclipses. It is elevated 80 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles.

The light is obscured over an arc of about 64°, or between the bearings of N. 84° W. (leading northward of the shoals off Cape Ceraso), and N. 20° W.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, and of the fifth order.

The lighthouse is square, built of brick, and painted white.

Position, latitude 40° 55′ 15′ N., longitude 9° 34′ 00″ E.

Note.—Approaching Terranova, this light should be kept in sight until the four floating lights in the entrance channel are visible.

ADRIATIC—EAST SHORE.—LISSA ISLAND.
(2.) Port S. Giorgio—Occasional Harbour Light.

The Austrian Government has given notice, dated 24th September, 1887, that when the steam vessels of the Austro-Hungarian Lloyds are expected, a harbour light is exhibited from the gable of a house, bearing W. by N. ½ N. from the Church Madonna am Ufer, on the south shore of Port S. Giorgio:—

The light is a fixed red light, elevated 14 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about one mile.

Information has been received through the Foreign Office, dated 22nd September, 1887, that the light was exhibited on 15th August, 1887:—

The light is a quick flashing light, visible between the bearings of N. 78° E., through south, to S. 36° W., elevated 90 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 15 miles.
