#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

##### *Interpretation Clause.*

1. In this Warrant the expression "Parcel," means a postal packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

*Places between which Parcels may be Transmitted.*

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by post between Malta and the British Post Offices at Constantinople and Smyrna.

##### *Rates of Postage.*

3. On all Parcels transmitted by post under this Warrant between Malta and the British Post Offices hereinbefore mentioned there shall be charged and paid the following rates of postage, that is to say:—

On every Parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, one shilling.

On every Parcel exceeding three pounds, and not exceeding seven pounds, in weight, two shillings.

On every Parcel exceeding seven pounds, and not exceeding eleven pounds, in weight, three shillings.

##### *Provisions of other Warrants to Apply.*

4. Every such Parcel shall be subject to the provisions of the respective Warrants of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury relating to the Parcel Post between the United Kingdom and Malta, between the United Kingdom and the British Post Office at Constantinople, and between the United Kingdom and the British Post Office at Smyrna, so far as such provisions are applicable.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

NEW GUINEA—SOUTH COAST.—FREDERICK HENRY ISLAND.

(1.) *Position of Shoal Ground South-Westward of Cape Valsche.*

THE Government of New South Wales has

given notice, dated 9th August, 1887, that Mr. Green, commanding the steam-vessel "Guthrie," obtained in lat. 8° 28' S., long. 137° 30' E., a depth of three fathoms, soft mud. Also, a depth of five fathoms was obtained nine miles westward of that position, and much discoloured water was seen still farther west.

This depth of three fathoms is 3½ miles further to seaward than is shown in the Admiralty charts, but as the locality has never been surveyed, and the astronomical position of Cape Valsche is extremely doubtful, the bank may not extend to such a distance from the land. Mariners should give this point a good berth.

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.—CUMBERLAND ISLANDS.

(2.) *Reported Rock Westward of Derwent Island (K 2).*

The Government of Queensland has given notice, dated 27th July, 1887, of the reported existence of a rock, north-westward of Derwent Island (K 2), Cumberland Islands.

The rock is stated to cover at about half-flood, and to lie N.W. by W. of the north-west extreme of Derwent Island, at a distance variously reported as from one quarter to three quarters of a mile.

(1.) *Intended Alteration in Character of Hirtsholm Light.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 294, of 14th December, 1886, and previous notice, on delay in the exhibition of the light from the new lighthouse, then in course of construction on Hirtsholm, and bearing S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., distant about 120 feet from the old lighthouse:—
