ASH RIFLE RANGE, ALDERSHOT CAMP.

BYE-LAWS made by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department, under the provisions of the Artillery and Rifle Ranges Act, 1885, with the consent of the Farnham Highway Board, for the purpose of regulating the above Range.

1. SUCH portion of the road known as the Ash Wharf-road as lies between a building known as Chandler's-cottages and the Rifle Ranges, and extends for a distance of 300 yards eastwards from the War Department boundary stone No. 263, towards the Rifle Ranges, is closed to all persons while firing is going on at the said ranges.

2. The limits between which the said road will be closed are marked eastward and westward by posts with copies of these Bye-laws attached thereto.

- 3. One hour before the commencement of rifler practice, red flags will also be hoisted on the said posts.
- 4. No person shall pass along the said road when the flags are flying without the special leave of the officer in command of the firing party.

5. No person allowed to pass along the road

while rifle practice is going on shall, on any account, diverge therefrom.

6. Any person contravening these Bye-laws shall be deemed to commit an offence against the same, and is, under the said Act, liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding five pounds.
