

consisting of the rectory of the parish church of Calstone Wellington and the rectory of the parish church of Blackland in the said county of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury, and we Douglas John Kinnier Macdonald of the Priory Salisbury in the said county of Wilts Esquire and James Patrick Hadow, of No. 25, Cambridge-square, Hyde Park, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, the other alternate patrons of the said united benefice (we the said Douglas John Kinnier Macdonald and James Patrick Hadow being entitled as alternate patrons on the nomination of Elizabeth Macdonald of Calstone Wellington aforesaid to present to the said united benefice if the same were now vacant); and I the Reverend George Randolph Hadow the incumbent of the same united benefice and I the Reverend Francis Houssemayne du Boulay of Heddington, in the county of Wilts, Clerk in Holy Orders the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice (being a rectory) and parish of Heddington in the county of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury (if the same were now vacant) I being also the incumbent of the same benefice do hereby signify consent to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

And whereas the said Bishop of Salisbury hath transmitted the said scheme to the Archbishop of Canterbury for his consideration and the said Archbishop being satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid, by his report, to Her Majesty in Council dated the twentieth day of September one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council:

"That the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Salisbury has represented unto us (amongst other things),—

"That there are in the county of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury the benefice (being a vicarage) and parish church of Calne the united benefice consisting of the rectory of the parish church of Calstone Wellington and of the rectory of the parish church of Blackland which were united by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the fifth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one and the benefice (being a rectory) of the parish church of Heddington.

"That portions of the said parish of Calne lie intermixed with and adjacent to the said parishes of Calstone and Blackland; that other portions of the said parish of Calne lie adjacent to the said parish of Heddington; and a detached portion of the said parish of Calstone Wellington lies between a portion of the said parish of Calne and the said parish of Heddington; and another detached portion of the said parish of Calstone Wellington lies in the middle of the parish of Calne.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that

under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the session holden in the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign chapter 106 the portions of the said parish of Calne that are shown on the maps marked B and C annexed to the said representation by the colours pink blue and red may be advantageously separated from the said benefice and parish church of Calne and that the said portions shown by the colour pink and described in the first schedule to the scheme appended to the said representation may be united and conveniently annexed to the said parish of Calstone Wellington and united benefice of Calstone Wellington and Blackland; that the said portions shown by the colour blue and described in the second schedule to the scheme appended to the said representation may be united and conveniently annexed to the said parish of Blackland and united benefice of Calstone Wellington and Blackland; and that the said portion coloured red and described in the third schedule to the scheme appended to the said representation may be united and conveniently annexed to the said parish of Heddington. That it also appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said detached portion of the said parish of Calstone Wellington which lies between the said parish of Calne and the said parish of Heddington and is shown on the map marked C annexed to the said representation by the colour yellow may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Calstone Wellington and the united benefice of Calstone and Blackland and be united and advantageously annexed to the said parish of Heddington; and that the detached portion of the said parish of Calstone Wellington which lies in the middle of the said parish of Calne may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Calstone Wellington and united benefice of Calstone and Blackland and be united and advantageously annexed to the said parish of Calne.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charges dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbents of the said benefices respectively has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.
