TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Definition.

1. In this Warrant the expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

Places between which Farcels may be Transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post by way of the United Kingdom and the several routes specified in the Schedule hereto between Natal and the countries mentioned in such Schedule.

Rotes of Postage.

3. On all Parcels transmitted by Post under this Warrant from Natal to any courtry mentioned in the Schedule hereto there shall be charged and paid according to the route of transmission and weight of such Parcels respectively the several rates of postage specified in such Schedule.

Maximum Dimensions.

- 4. There shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post under this Warrant any Parcel exceeding the following dimensions, that is to say:—
 - (1.) Any Parcel posted in Natal addressed to any of the places mentioned in the Schedule hereto except Algeria, Corsica, Tunis, and Italy, or posted in any of such places addressed to Natal which shall exceed in any direction two feet.
 - (2.) Any Parcel posted in Natal addressed to Algeria, Corsica, Tunis, or Italy, or posted in Algeria, Corsica, Tunis, or Italy addressed to Natal which shall exceed in length two feet, or in length and girth four feet, such girth being measured round the thickest part of such parcel.

Maximum Weight.

5. There shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post under this Warrant any Parcel exceeding seven pounds in weight.

Mode of Posting.

- 6. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, all Parcels shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the provisions of the Warrants respectively relating to the Parcel Post between Natal and the United Kingdom, and to the Parcel Post between the United Kingdom and the country or place to which the Parcel shall be addressed so far as such provisions are applicable.
- 7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
