

within the said new parish of Bicton, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be, and the same is hereby, substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to the Holy Trinity as aforesaid) of the same new parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said new parish of Bicton, in lieu of the said old parish church of the same new parish, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of the Holy Trinity, so hereby substituted, had been originally the parish church of the same new parish.

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to the Holy Trinity as aforesaid), of the said new parish of Bicton, or of or belonging to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of the Holy Trinity (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said new parish of Bicton), and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said William Dalrymple, Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said John Yardley and George Newton Lloyd have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals this seventeenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

#### Guildford Union.—Parish of Stoke.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Stoke, in the county of Surrey;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS on application duly made by the Churchwardens of the said parish of Stoke, the Poor Law Board, by an Order dated the 5th day of July, 1853, directed that so much of the Act passed in the 14th year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, should forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish, described in such Order as "Stoke-next-Guildford."

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Friday, the 2nd day of December, 1887, it was resolved,—

"That this Vestry consent to the hiring from the Managers of the Parochial Schools, for a period of two years from the 1st January next, of the Infant Schoolroom for the purpose of holding Vestry and other Parish Meetings, under the provisions of 13 and 14 Vict., c. 57, at a payment of five shillings for each hiring, and the Churchwardens were requested to apply to the Local Government Board for their Order sanctioning such arrangement."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made application in writing to us, the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above-recited resolution:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, we hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the above-cited Act as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish.

ARTICLE II.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.
