

IN pursuance of the directions contained in an Act of Parliament passed in the 34th year of the reign of King George Third, intituled "An Act for dividing and enclosing the common and open fields, meadows, commonable lands, and waste grounds, within the parish of Shelton, in the county of Bedford, we, the undersigned the Right Honourable Beauchamp Moubray Lord Saint John, and William Whitehead, of Shelton Hall, in the county of Bedford, and Jane Elizabeth his wife, being severally owners and proprietors of lands and hereditaments within the said parish which, under and by virtue of the said Act of Parliament, are subject and liable to the payment of corn rent in lieu of tithes, do hereby give notice that application will be made to the Justices of the Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be holden in and for the county of Bedford aforesaid, in the week succeeding the close of the Feast of Easter, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to have two persons not being interested in the said premises named by the Justices then and there to be assembled, to be, together with a third person to be chosen by such two persons, arbitrators or referees for inquiring into and ascertaining, by the means in the said Act mentioned, the average price of a Winchester bushel of good marketable wheat, within the county of Bedford, for the ten years then last past, in order that the said arbitrators or referees, or any two of them, shall by their report to be delivered to the Justices at the Court of Quarter Sessions, to be held in the first week after the Translation of Saint Thomas the Martyr then next ensuing, set forth such average price as aforesaid, to the end that the yearly rent payable to the Rector of the said parish of Shelton for the time being, in lieu of tithes, may be increased or diminished accordingly, and that the exact amount of the said yearly rent or sum to which the same shall be so increased or diminished, shall be declared by the Order of the said Court, conformably with the directions of the said Act.—Dated this 19th day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
