3. No grant can be made to any benefice—

(a.) Whose net income from all sources exceeds
£200 per annum.

(b.) Which has not a duly consecrated church.

4. The Governors have power to make as many
as three grants in one year to the same benefice
to meet three separate benefactions.

The rate of interest on new augmentation moneys
will be 3 per Cent.
