

chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wakefield-street aforesaid and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Katharine-road, and extending thence first northward and then north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts thereby passing over the line of the London Tilbury and Southend Railway to the junction of the same road with Red Post-lane and with the road called or known as Plashet-grove and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eleven and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Shrewsbury-road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to a point at present north-western end of the same road, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of East Ham from the district chapelry of All Saints Forest Gate in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence generally south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts to its junction in Gipseylane with the boundary which divides the said parish of East Ham from the new parish of Forest Gate in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of two chains or thereabouts, thereby following the middle of Gipseylane aforesaid, to the junction of the said last-mentioned boundary with the boundary which divides the last-named new parish from the parish of West Ham aforesaid and extending thence westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts thereby passing between Saint George's-terrace and Oakdale-road and crossing Saint George's-avenue to a point in the middle of Bilton-road and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Elmhurst-road and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stukeley-road and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to a point at its junction with Manor-road, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of West Ham from the new parish of Saint Mary Plaistow aforesaid and continuing thence still in precisely the same direction, that is to say southward and in a straight line for a distance of seventeen and a half chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the line of the London Tilbury and Southend Railway aforesaid and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 313 Queen's-road, from the house and premises known as 315 Queen's-road and extending thence southward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its southern end on the northern side of Queen's-road aforesaid at or near to the junction of that road with Saint Mary's-road and extending thence first southward to, and then southward and south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Western-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its intersection by the public footpath which leads from Plaistow into Green-street

aforesaid and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned public footpath for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to a point at its junction with Green-street aforesaid near to the building known as 'Anne Boleyn's Tower,' upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary Plaistow from the parish of East Ham aforesaid and extending thence southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts thereby following the course of Green-street aforesaid to the junction of the same boundary with the boundary which divides the said parish of East Ham from the new parish of Saint Andrew Plaistow as aforesaid and continuing thence still southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of six chains or thereabouts thereby still following the course of Green-street aforesaid, to the first-described point at the junction of Green-street with the Barking-road as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for compensating a spiritual person to wit the Reverend John Coulson Clerk in Holy Orders incumbent of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, South Shields, in the diocese of Durham, whose emoluments as such incumbent have been diminished by reason of proceedings under one or both of the said Acts.

"Whereas in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three the district of Saint Jude South Shields was constituted under the New Parishes Acts or some or one of them out of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity South Shields and the same district of Saint Jude South Shields became a new parish on the thirteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the fees dues or other emoluments of the said John Coulson as such incumbent as aforesaid
