

thereabouts (thereby following the boundary which divides the said township of Cocklaw from the township of Wall aforesaid) to the point near to the cottage called or known as 'The Tithe Barn,' where the same military road is joined by Drove-road, and extending thence generally northward to and along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of one mile and a half or thereabouts (thereby passing to the east of the house called or known as Keepwick Fell, and to east of Cocklaw Dean, and crossing Swallow Burn), to the junction of the said last-named road with the Cocklaw and Errington-road, and extending thence in a direction due north and in a straight line for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to the boundary, at Erring Burn, which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint Oswald-in-Lee with Saint Mary Bingfield from the parish of Chollerton aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Newcastle.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, in the words following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for compensating a spiritual person, to wit, the Reverend John Gornall, Clerk in Holy Orders, Incumbent of the district parish of Saint Thomas, Collierley, in the diocese of Durham, whose emoluments as such incumbent have been diminished by reason of proceedings under one or both of the said Acts.

"Whereas in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, the district of Saint John the Evangelist, Dipton, was constituted under the New Parishes Acts, or some or one of them, partly out of the said district parish of Saint Thomas, Collierley, and partly out of the parochial chapelry of Tanfield, also in the said diocese of Durham, and the same district of Saint John the Evangelist, Dipton, became a new parish on the twenty-ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us, that the fees, dues, or other emoluments of the said John Gornall, as such incumbent as

aforesaid, have been diminished by reason of the constitution of the said district and new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dipton, and that the payment to the said John Gornall of the annual sum of ten pounds would provide a just and reasonable compensation for such diminution.

Now therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose, that, in respect of, and in compensation for the diminution aforesaid, there shall be paid by us to the said John Gornall, so long as he shall continue to be the incumbent of the said district parish of Saint Thomas Collierley, and no longer the annual sum of ten pounds, payment of such annual sum being made (except as to the back payments hereinafter mentioned) in equal half-yearly portions, upon the first day of May and the first day of November in each year, but with the right also to a proportionate payment in respect of any period, being less than half a year, which may elapse between the first day of May and the first day of November (as the case may be) in any year, and the avoidance, from whatever cause, by the said John Gornall, of the incumbency of the said district parish of Saint Thomas Collierley.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the right of the said John Gornall to receive the said annual sum of ten pounds shall be held to have accrued, and that payment thereof shall accordingly be made, as from the twenty-ninth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, that being, as aforesaid, the day upon which the cure, in respect of the constitution of which such compensation is made, became a new parish, and upon which, therefore, the incumbent of such new parish became empowered to perform in the church thereof those offices and became entitled to retain for his own benefit those fees, in consideration of the loss of which to the said John Gornall the amount of the compensation grant in this scheme recommended and proposed has been fixed by us.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.
