

Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the tenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Swansea in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Saint Davids.

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-first day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-ninth day of the same month, a part of the parish of Saint Mary Swansea in the said county of Glamorgan and in the said diocese of Saint Davids was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity situate in the parish of Saint Mary Swansea aforesaid and the same was called ‘The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity Swansea.’

“ And whereas the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Swansea has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the said above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

“ And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Swansea should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

“ Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Davids (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Swansea, shall be altered by way of extension so as to include therein all those portions of the said parish of Saint Mary Swansea, which are described in the schedule hereunder written and are together with the boundaries thereof delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and are thereon coloured pink, and that from and after the same day and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portions of the said parish of Saint Mary Swansea so to be included as aforesaid shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Swansea.

“ And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be annexed to the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Swansea within the original limits of the parish of Saint Mary, Swansea, in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Saint Davids, comprising:—

“ I. All that portion of the said parish of Saint Mary Swansea wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded upon the east by the consolidated chapelry of All Saints Kilvey, or in other words by the North Dock, upon the north-east by parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John-juxta-Swansea, upon the north-west by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew Swansea all in the county and diocese aforesaid, upon the west by the new parish of the Holy Trinity Swansea aforesaid, and upon the remaining side, that is to say upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Swansea from the parish of Saint Mary Swansea aforesaid at the point at the southern end of High-street, Swansea, where it is joined by College-street, by Castle Bailey-street and by Welcome-lane, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the street called or known as the Strand and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of two and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with the street called or known as Strand-row and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of the line of the Swansea Branch of the Great Western Railway and extending thence in a direction due east and in a straight line for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts thereby crossing the said branch line of railway to the boundary in the middle of the North Dock aforesaid which boundary divides the said parish of Saint Mary Swansea from the consolidated chapelry of All Saints Kilvey aforesaid.

“ II. And also all that other portion of the said parish of Saint Mary Swansea wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded upon the south and upon the east by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Swansea, upon the north-west and upon the north-east by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew Swansea aforesaid and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew Swansea from the parish of Saint Mary Swansea aforesaid at a point in the middle of Gibbethill-road opposite to the north-western end of the footway or passage which leads to the eastern side of Hill Chapel and extending thence, that is from the said point in the middle of Gibbethill-road aforesaid, south-westward along the middle of the same road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Crnig-place, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the boundary, at the junction of the same road with the roadway leading to Fuller's-row, which boundary divides the said parish of Saint Mary Swansea, from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Swansea aforesaid.”
