

As soon as The Queen's carriage crossed Windsor Bridge, the Royal Standard was hoisted on the Round Tower, and the bells of the Parish Church and of St. George's Chapel were rung until Her Majesty arrived opposite Castle Hill.

His Royal Highness The Grand Duke of Hesse, K.G., Their Grand Ducal Highnesses The Princesses Irène and Alix of Hesse, Their Royal Highnesses The Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, K.G., The Prince Henry of Battenberg, K.G., and The Hereditary Grand Duke of Hesse, G.C.B., His Serene Highness The Prince Louis of Battenberg, G.C.B., Her Grand Ducal Highness The Princess Louis of Battenberg, and The Marquis of Lorne, K.T., awaited The Queen on the Castle Hill, having been conducted to their places by The Mayor of Windsor.

The Field Officer in Brigade Waiting, Colonel J. Sterling, Coldstream Guards, and The Silver Stick in Waiting, Colonel The Hon. R. Talbot, C.B., 1st Life Guards, were in Attendance on Castle Hill.

The Windsor Castle guard, made up to 100 rank and file, was mounted as a guard of honour in front of Henry VIII.'s gateway, facing south, under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel J. Montgomery, 1st Battalion Coldstream Guards.

A second guard of honour of 100 rank and file of the Berkshire Volunteers was mounted on Castle Hill, facing Henry VIII.'s gateway, under the command of Major R. R. Holmes.

The Queen's carriage halted at the foot of Castle Hill.

Her Majesty was received with a Royal salute.

An address from the Jubilee Committee was presented to The Queen by their Chairman, H. Simpson, Esq., The Mayor of Windsor, and read by their Hon. Secretary, George H. Long, Esq.

Her Majesty returned a gracious reply to the Address.

A representative from every parish and place contributing to the Jubilee fund was presented to The Queen by The Lord in Waiting, General The Viscount Bridport, K.C.B.

His Royal Highness The Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, K.G., Lord High Steward of the Borough of New Windsor; having taken Her Majesty's pleasure, directed the unveiling of the statue, to commemorate The Queen having reigned for 50 years, erected on Castle Hill, Windsor, by the inhabitants of the borough of New Windsor, including the parishes of Holy Trinity and Clewer, St. Stephen, and by the inhabitants of the following places:—Ascot, Bray Wood, Clewer, Colnbrook, Cranbourne, Dornay, Englefield Green, Eton, Hitcham, Horton, Old Windsor, Sunningdale, Sunninghill, Virginia Water, Windsor Park and Forest, Winkfield, Wyardisbury.
