Her Majesty travelled by a special train on the Great Western Railway to Paddington, where the Royal carriages were in waiting, and drove from thence, escorted by a Captain's Escort of the 2nd Life Guards, under the Command of Captain Smith-Cuninghame, to South Kensington, where Her Majesty laid the first stone of the Imperial Institute of the United Kingdom, the Colonies, and India.

The ceremony took place on a raised dais in the centre of a very large pavilion, specially erected for the purpose, surrounded by seats for spectators.

The Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers, Cabinet Ministers, Members of both Houses of Parliament, and other distinguished persons invited to be present at the ceremony, entered the Pavilion by the main entrance in the Exhibition Road, and were shewn to seats specially reserved for them.

Certain subscribers to the funds of the Imperial Institute also had places reserved for them, and were admitted at the main entrance.

The Organising Committee of the Imperial Institute, as well as others taking part in the ceremony, entered the Pavilion by the main entrance, and assembled in the Entrance Hall at a quarter past 11 o'clock.
