WE, the undersigned, Johnson Selby, of Epworth, in the county of Lincoln, Farmer, Richard Maw, of the same place, Retired Miller, Thomas John Blaydes, of the same place, Currier and Farmer, and John Standing, of the same place, Farmer, being respectively owners and proprietors of lands and hereditaments in the parish of Epworth, in the county of Lincoln,

liable to the payment of corn rents, and of a sum of four hundred and twenty pounds directed to be paid to the Rector of Epworth under and by virtue of the provisions of an Act of Parliament made and passed in the thirty-fifth year of the reign of King George the Third, intituled "An Act for dividing, allotting, inclosing, draining, and improving the commons and waste grounds within the several parishes of Epworth,
