THE Queen has been graciously pleased to appoint Audley Charles Gosling, Esq., now Secretary to Her Majesty's Legation at Madrid, to be Secretary to Her Majesty's Embassy at Madrid.

THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto Sir John Poynder Dickson, of Hartham Park, Corsham, and Hilmarton Manor, both in the county of Wilts, and of Sydenham, in the county of Roxburgh, Baronet, only son of John Bourmaster Dickson, Esquire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Retired Admiral in Her Majesty's Fleet, by his first wife, Sarah Matilda, daughter of Thomas Poynder, late of Hilmarton Manor aforesaid, Esquire, and sister of Thomas Henry Allen Poynder, late of Upper Brook-street, Grosvenor-square, in the county of Middlesex, and of Hartham Park and Hilmarton Manor aforesaid, Esquire, all deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of his maternal uncle, the said Thomas Henry Allen Poynder, henceforth take, and hereafter continue to use the surname of Poynder, in addition to and after that of Dickson, and that he may bear the arms of Poynder quarterly with those of Dickson; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, January 23, 1888.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies a copy of a Despatch, dated 2nd instant, from Her Majesty's Acting Governor of Cyprus, stating that the measures hitherto in force against arrivals from Sicily and Malta have been revoked, and a medical visit substituted.

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, in the manner required by the said Act, that the Right Honourable John George Gibson, Serjeant-at-Law, late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the Walton Division of the borough of Liverpool, hath accepted the office of one of the Justices of Her Majesty's High Court of Justice in Ireland, and has been gazetted thereto in the Dublin Gazette, dated the 20th day of January, 1888, and has thereby vacated his seat; and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said Walton Division of the borough of Liverpool, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
