

I SIR HICKMAN BECKETT BACON, of Thonock Hall, in the parish of Gainsborough, in the county of Lincoln, Premier Baronet (being an owner and proprietor of lands in the township of Gainsborough, in the said parish of Gainsborough, liable to the payment of corn rents under and by virtue of the Act of Parliament hereinafter mentioned and assessed to the poor's rate for the said township at the sum of one hundred pounds and upwards), do hereby give notice that (in pursuance of the powers and directions contained in a certain Act of Parliament made and passed in the 35th year of the reign of King George the Third, intitled "An Act for inclosing, dividing, allotting, draining, embanking, and improving the open and common fields, meadows, pastures, commons, wastes, and other unenclosed grounds within the township of Gainsburgh, in the parish of Gainsburgh, in the county of Lincoln, and also for making a compensation for the tithes arising within the said township and within the lordship of Thonock, in the said parish"), I intend to apply at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden in and for the division of Lindsey, in the county of Lincoln, in the first week after the 31st day of March next, and which General Quarter Sessions at the time of the passing of the said last-mentioned Act were accustomed to be held in the week after the Feast of Easter in each year, to have three persons named or appointed by the Justices then and there assembled to be arbitrators or referees for enquiring into and ascertaining, by means of the London Gazette, or otherwise, as in the said Act mentioned, the average price of a Winchester bushel of good marketable wheat within the said county of Lincoln for the twenty-one years then last past, so that the yearly corn rents (by the Award in pursuance of the said Act made) due and payable to the Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors, and his and their lessee and lessees, and the Vicar of Gainsburgh, and his successors respectively, out of the several allotments in the said township of Gainsburgh charged with the payment thereof by the Award of the Commissioners named and appointed in and by the said Act, may be increased or diminished pursuant to and in conformity with the directions of the said Act.—Dated this 20th day of January, 1888.

average price of a Winchester bushel of good marketable wheat, within the said county of Derby, for fourteen years then last past; which said three arbitrators or referees, or the major part of them, shall, by their report, to be made and delivered to the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for the county of Derby in the first week after the Feast of the Translation of Saint Thomas the Martyr then next ensuing, set forth such average price; and in case it shall by such report appear that such average price of a bushel of such wheat is more or less than the average price thereof set forth in the said award, by the value of three pence or upwards, then the said respective yearly rents or sums of money shall be increased or diminished, as shall be declared by Order of the said Court, and the same shall, from the quarterly day of payment preceding such Order, remain and continue issuing and payable as aforesaid, out of the several lands and estates charged by the said award with such respective yearly rents or sums of money, until the same shall, at or after the end of fourteen years thence next ensuing, be again varied by such application, and in such manner as hereinbefore mentioned, and so from time to time, at or after the end of fourteen years, for ever.—Dated this 9th day of January, 1888.
