WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of certain land, comprising one thousand one hundred and seventy-three square yards, or thereabouts, which has been permanently secured to the consolidated chapelry and benefice (hereinafter called the benefice) of Saint Chad, Everton, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Liverpool, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said benefice of Saint Chad, Everton, to meet such benefaction, one capital sum of nine hundred and sixteen pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said benefice, according to
