

NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, January 30, 1888.

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested therein, that preparations are now being made for the intended distribution of the slave bounty, &c., awarded for the slave dhow "Ter-el-Nil," and 26 slaves, captured on the 23rd March, 1886, by Her Majesty's ship "Dolphin."

Agents or other persons having any just and legal demand, unliquidated, against the award, are required to transmit the particulars of any such demand to the Registrar of the Admiralty Division of Her Majesty's High Court of Justice, in order that the same may be examined, taxed, and allowed by that Officer, and paid under the sanction of the Judge of the said Court.

Due notice will be given, by future advertisement in the London Gazette, of the date proposed for the commencement of distribution; and, at the same time, the amount of an individual's share in the respective classes will be announced.

NOTICE is hereby given to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of prize money for the capture, by Her Majesty's ship "Condor," of two slave dhows and two slaves, on 14th and 16th January, 1886, will commence on Tuesday, the 7th proximo, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Spring-gardens, S.W."

Agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any captor serving in the above-named ship, are requested to present the same at this office.

Any Officer, Seaman, Marine, or other person, who may desire to receive his share from the Collector of Customs or of Inland Revenue within the United Kingdom, is required to intimate the same by letter to be addressed "On Prize Business, to the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, London, S.W." (enclosing his certificate of service, or an attested copy thereof, excepting in the case of Commissioned Officers), —in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.

Huddersfield Union. — Township of Uppertong.

To the Overseers of the Poor of the Township of Uppertong, in the West Riding of the county of York;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the said township of Uppertong, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said township held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on the 1st day of December, 1887, it was resolved:—

"That the Local Government Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled 'An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,' shall be applied to and put in force within this parish (or township), as regards the holding of Vestry Meetings."

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said township have made application in writing to us, the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above-recited resolution:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, we hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the above-cited Act as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said township.

ARTICLE II.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Overseers of the Poor of the said township.

(Alteration and Amendment of the Memorandum of Association of the Company with Reference to Investment of Funds; Change of Name; and for other Purposes).

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session by the United States and South American Investment Trust Company Limited, hereinafter called "the Company," for an Act, hereinafter called "the intended Act," for the following purposes (that is to say):

To alter, amend, extend, vary, or repeal, so far as may be necessary or desirable for any of the purposes of the intended Act, any of the conditions or provisions contained in the Memorandum of Association of the Company, dated the 4th day of December, 1886, and registered under the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1880.

To alter, extend, and amend the provisions of Clause 3 of the Company's Memorandum of Association as regards the investment and application of the Company's capital and other moneys howsoever raised or obtained, and generally to alter and extend the Company's objects as set forth in that clause, and generally to define and declare the objects and powers of the Company

To change the name of the Company.
