In the High Court of Justice.—Chancery Division.

Mr. Justice Kay.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867, and in the Matter of the Aberavon Tin Plate Company Limited.

BY an Order made in the above matters, by Mr. Justice Chitty, dated Saturday, the 21st day of January, 1888, upon the petition of the Aberavon Tin Plate Company Limited, of Aberavon, in the county of Glamorgan, on the 13th day of January, 1888, preferred into this Court, and upon hearing Counsel for the petitioners, and for the Rhymney Iron Company and others, and for William Evans and other workmen, creditors supporting the petition, and upon reading the said petition, an affirmation of Henry John Millner, made on the 16th, and filed the 17th day of January, 1888, verifying the said petition, the London Gazette of the 13th day of January, 1888, the Western Mail newspaper of the 16th January, 1888, and the South Wales Daily News newspaper of the 16th January, 1888, each containing an advertisement of the said petition, an affidavit of Samuel Taylor, filed the 20th January, 1888, an affidavit of William Evans, filed the 20th January, 1888, and an affidavit of William Henry Forster, filed the 21st January, 1888, it was ordered that the voluntary winding up of the Aberavon Tin Plate Company be continued, but subject to the supervision of this Court, and any of the proceedings under the said voluntary winding up might be adopted as the Judge should think fit, and the creditors, contributories, and Liquidators of the of the said Company, and all other persons interested, were to be at liberty to apply to the Judge at Chambers, as there might be occasion; and it was ordered that John Jones, of Aberavon, Coal and Iron Merchant, be appointed Liquidator of the said Company, without giving security jointly with Samuel Taylor, the present Liquidator of the said Company; and it was ordered that the said Samuel Taylor and John Jones do forthwith raise out of the assets of the said Company a sufficient sum to pay the wages in arrear of the workmen of the said Company, and do pay the same accordingly; and it was ordered that the costs of the petitioners, and of the said creditors supporting the petition of the said application, be taxed by the Taxing Master, and be paid out of the assets of the said Company, and in such taxation a separate set of costs was to be allowed to the said William Evans and others.—Dated the 30th day of January, 1888.
