In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing

them.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the second and third years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act for regulating the Police Courts of the Metropolis," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty with the advice of Her Privy Council, to alter the number of the Police Courts and to alter the number of Magistrates appointed to any of the said Courts.

"And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the eleventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, Her Majesty was pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order and it was thereby ordered accordingly that the parishes of Fulham and Kensington (including so much of Brompton as has not been assigned by any Order in Council to the Police Court called "Queen Square Police Court; and such part of the parish of Saint Margaret Westminster as adjoins the parish of Hammersmith; and also that portion of the parish of Chelsea, commonly called Kensal Green, situate to the north of the said parish of Kensington); the parish of Hammersmith and the parishes of Acton and Chiswick, all in the county of Middlesex, and within the Metropolitan Police District, should thenceforth be constituted a Police Court Division; and that a Police Court should be estabblished for such division to be holden at Kensington, in the said parish of Kensington, until the erection of a Police Court at Hammersmith, in the said parish of Hammersmith, in the county and district aforesaid; 'and that immediately upon the completion of such Court-house at Hammersmith the said Police Court should thenceforth be holden therein at Hammersmith aforesaid.

" And Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her said Council was pleased further to order and it was thereby ordered accordingly that the parishes of Wandsworth, Putney, Battersea, Tooting-Graveney (sometimes called Tooting), Merton, Wimbledon, Barnes, and Clapham, and the hamlet of Roehampton, all in the county of Surrey, and within the said Metropolitan Police District, together with so much of the parish of Streatham as comprises Upper Tooting and Balham Hill in the same county and district, should thenceforth be constituted a Police Court Division; and that a Police Court should be established for such division, to be holden at Wandsworth in the said

parish of Wandsworth.

· And Her Majesty was further pleased with the advice aforesaid to order and it was thereby ordered accordingly that the Magistrates who should have been or should thereafter be appointed for the said divisions should attend daily at such respective Courts, excepting Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or any day appointed for a Public Fast or Thanksgiving; and that one of the Magistrates appointed or to be appointed as aforesaid should attend at the said Wandsworth Police Court from ten of the clock in the morning until I day appointed for this Order to take effect the

one of the clock in the afternoon; and that one of the said Magistrates should attend at the said Kensington Police Court (until the erection of a Police Court-house as aforesaid, and after the completion thereof at the said Hammersmith Police Court) from two of the clock in the afternoon until five of the clock in the afternoon, and longer if (in the discretion of the Magistrate) it should be deemed to be necessary for the despatch of business

"And Her Majesty was further pleased by and with the advice of Her said Council to order, and it was thereby ordered accordingly, that the said Order should take effect on and from the twentyeighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred

and forty-two.

"And whereas by a subsequent Order in Council bearing date the twenty-first day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventytwo, Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council deemed it expedient to rescind and vacate so much of the said last-mentioned Order as related to the times of attendance of the Magistrates at such respective Courts. Her Majesty was pleased with the advice of Her said Council to order and it was thereby ordered accordingly that in lieu of the times named in the said lastmentioned Order for the attendance of the Magistrates at the said Courts the Magistrates who should have been or should thereafter be appointed for the said divisions should attend daily at such respective Courts, excepting Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or any day appointed for a Public Fast or Thanksgiving; and that one of the Magistrates appointed or to be appointed as aforesaid should attend at the Hammersmith Police Court from ten of the clock in the morning until half-past one of the clock in the afternoon, and longer if (in the discretion of the Mugistrate) it should be deemed necessary for the despatch of business; and that one of the said Magistrates should attend at the Wandsworth Police Court from half-past two of the clock in the afternoon until five of the clock in the afternoon, and longer if (in the discretion of the Magistrate) it should be deemed necessary for the despatch of business.

"And whereas Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council has deemed it expedient to rescind and vacate so much of the saidlast-mentioned Order as relates to the times of attendance of the Magistrates at such respective courts, Her Majesty is pleased with the advice of Her said Council to order and it is hereby ordered accordingly that in lieu of the times named in the said last-mentioned Order for the attendance of the Magistrates at the said Courts the Magistrates who shall have been or shall hereafter be appointed for the said divisions shall attend daily at such respective Courts, excepting Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday or any day appointed for a Public Fast or Thanksgiving that is to say that one of the Magistrates appointed or to be appointed as aforesaid shall attend at the Hammersmith Police Court from ten of the clock in the morning until five of the cleck in the afternoon, and longer if (in the discretion of the Magistrate) it shall be deemed to be necessary for the despatch of business; and that one of the said Magistrates shall attend at the Wandsworth Police Court from ten of the clock in the morning until five of the clock in the afternoon, and longer if (in the discretion of the Magistrate) it shall be deemed to be necessary for the despatch of business.

"Her Majesty is further pleased with the advice of Her said Council to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly that on and after the

Hammersmith Police Court and the Wandsworth Police Court shall be served conjointly by three Magistrates who shall be appointed to the said Courts conjointly."

And Her Majesty is further pleased by and with the advice of Her said Council to order and it is hereby ordered accordingly that this Order shall take effect on and from the second day of April; one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

And the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the second and third years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act for regulating the Police Courts in the Metropolis," it was, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Conncil to alter the number of the Police Courts, and to alter the number of Magistrates appointed to any of the said Courts, and to order such changes to be made of the places in which they should be holden within the Metropolitan Police District as should be found expedient, and every such Court should thenceforth be holden in the place in or to which it should be so ordered to be established or removed.

And whereas also by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for better defining the Powers of Justices within the Metropolitan Police District" it was amongst other things enacted "that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council from time to time to constitute within the Metropolitan Police District so many Police Court Divisions as to Her Majesty should seem fit and to define the extent thereof and from time to time to alter the number and extent of such Police Court Divisions, and to assign a division to each of the Police Courts already established, and to establish a Police Court for each of the other divisions.

WORSHIP STREET POLICE COURT.

Her Majesty therefore is pleased with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that the space included within the following boundary (the same being within the Metropolitan Police District) that is to say, from the boundary of the city of London in Whitechapel High-street in a line running eastward along the centre thereof and of Whitechapel-road and Mile End-road to Globeroad, thence along the centre of Globe-road to the southern side of the Great Eastern Railway, thence eastward along the same to the River Lee and along the centre of the said river and Hackney Cut to the Hertford Union Canal, thence westward along the centre of the said canal and the Regent's Canal to Shepherdess-walk, thence southward along the centre thereof and of Bathstreet and of Bunhill-row, to the boundary of the city of London, and thence along the said boundary to Whitechapel High-street aforesaid, shall from and after the day appointed for this Order to take effect, constitute a Police Court Division and be assigned to the Police Court called the Worship Street Police Court.

CLERKENWELL POLICE COURT.

Her Majesty is further pleased, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly that the space included within the following boundary (the same being within the Metropolitan Police District) that is to say, from the boundary of the city of London in Type-street in a line running northward along the boundary of the district of the Worship-street Police Court to the Rosemary Branch Bridge on the Regent's Canal, thence northwestward along the centres of Shepperton-road, Rotherfield - street, Canonbury - street, Willow-bridge-road, Grange-road, Highbury-grove, Highbury - park, Highbury - vale, Blackstock - road, Stroud Green-road, and Crouch Hill, thence westward along Hornsey-lane to Dartmouth Parkhill, thence along the centres of Dartmouth Parkhill and Brecknock-road to the Camden-road, thence along the centre thercof to the Red Cap public-house, thence along the centre of Highstreet in Camden Town and of Seymour-street to Euston-road, thence along the boundary of the district assigned to the Bow-street Police Court to the boundary of the city of London at Holborn, and thence along the said city boundary to Typestreet aforesaid, shall on and after the appointed for this Order to take effect constitute a Police Court Division and be assigned to the Police Court called Clerkenwell Police Court.

DALSTON POLICE COURT.

Her Majesty is further pleased, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that the space included within the following boundary (the same being within the Metropolitan Police District), that is to say, from the boundary of the Worship-street Police Court at the junction of the River Lee with Hackney Cut, northward along the said River Lee to Spring Bridge at Stamford Hill, thence westward to Bayley's-lane and along St. Ann's-road, crossing Green-lanes, and thence in a straight line to the boundary of the district assigned to Clerkenwell Police Court by this Order and thence along the said boundary to the Rosemary Branch Bridge on the Regent's Canal, and thence along the boundary of the district assigned to the Worship-street Police Court by this Order, to the River Lee at its junction with Hackney Cut aforesaid, shall on and after the day appointed for this Order to take effect constitute a Police Court Division and be assigned to a Police Court to be called the Dalston Police Court, which is to be erected or fitted up at a place within the said boundary and near to the Dalston Junction of the North London Railway.

"Her Majesty is further pleased with the advice of Her said Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that on and after the day appointed for this Order to take effect, the Clerkenwell Police Court and the Dalston Police Court shall be served conjointly by three Magistrates, who shall be appointed to the said Courts conjointly, and one of such Magistrates shall attend daily at such respective Courts excepting Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or any day appointed for a Public Fast or Thanksgiving, from ten of the clock in the morning until five of the clock in the afternoon, and longer if (in the discretion of the Magistrate) it shall be deemed to be necessary for the despatch of business.

All former Orders in Council so far as they relate to the Police Court Divisions thereby assigned to the Worship-street Police Court and the Clerkenwell Police Court respectively shall

cease to be of any force or validity on and after the day appointed for this Order to take effect."

And Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice of Her said Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that this Order shall take effect on and from the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

And the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding " of benefices in plurality, and to make better "provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it "shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, "with respect to his own diocese, and whenever "it shall be represented to him by the Bishop "of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or " that one or more benefice or benefices, and one " or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, " vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or " dioceses, being either in the same parish or con-" tiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate "population shall not exceed one thousand five "hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Pro-"vince shall inquire into the circumstances of " the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear "to him that such union may be usefully made, "and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that "the patron or patrons of the said benefices, " sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicar-"ages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, " such consent being signified in writing under the " hands of such patron or patrons, the said Arch-"bishop shall, six weeks before certifying such "inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as herein-"after directed, cause, with respect to his own "diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, "and in other cases a copy in writing of the " aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near "the principal outer door of the church, or in "some public and conspicuous place in each of "such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, " with notice to any person or persons interested, "that he, she, or they, may, within such six " weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or "their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, "against such union; and if no sufficient cause " be shown within such time, the said Archbishop "shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid "to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it " shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to " make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting " such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, "vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with " cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; "and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in "Council to give directions for regulating the "course and succession in which the patrons, if "there be more than one patron, shall present or " nominate to such united benefice, from time to " time, as the same shall become vacant."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the tenth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Edward Lord Bishop of Lincoln as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the vicarage of Scamblesby in the county of Lincoln and the vicarage of Cawkwell otherwise Calkwell in the same county and diocese having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons and the aggregate yearly value does not exceed five hundred pounds might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln being the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said vicarage of Scamblesby if the same were now vacant and the Right Honourable Charles Alfred Worsley Anderson Pelham Earl of Yarborough the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said vicarage of Cawkwell otherwise Calkwell if the same were now vacant consent to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes and for declaring that the course and succession in which the patrons shall present or nominate to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows that is to say that the patronage of such united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the respective benefices in manner following that is to say the first and second turns in every three turns shall belong to and be exercised by the patron for the time being of the said vicarage of Scamblesby and the third turn in every three turns shall belong to and be exercised by the patron for the time being of the said vicarage of Cawkwell otherwise Calkwell and so on in the same order for ever

"As witness our hand this tenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the vicarage of Scamblesby situate in the county and diocese of Lincoln, and the vicarage of Cawkwell, otherwise Calkwell, situate in the same county and diocese, shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of her said Council, is further pleased to direct that the course and succession in which the respective patrons shall present or nominate to such united benefice, from time to time as the same shall become vacant, shall be as follows that is to say:—the first and second turns in every three turns shall belong to and be exercised by the patron for the time being of the said vicarage of Scamblesby, and the third turn in every three turns shall belong to and be exercised by the patron for the time being of the said vicarage of Cawkwell otherwise Calkwell, and so on in the same order for ever.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—those parts of the parishes of Bothwell and Shotts lying to the north of the highway leading from Glasgow to Edinburgh by way of Holytown and Newhouse, in the county of Lanark,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies the following copy of a Notice, dated 2nd ultimo, recently issued by the Government of Cyprus respecting arrivals in that island from Rhodes:—

In consequence of an outbreak of small-pox at Rhodes, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, under the power and authority vested in him by "The Infectious Diseases Prevention Ordinance, 1883," has been pleased to order that all passengers arriving thence will be submitted to the following regulations before being allowed to land in Cyprus:—

Any vessel arriving at any port in Cyprus, except Larnaca, from any part of Rhodes with pussengers for Cyprus is to be medically inspected before being admitted to pratique, and, in the event of their being any case, or suspected case, of small-pox on board, pratique will be refused, and the vessel is to be ordered to proceed to Larnaca, a note to that effect being made on the bill of health, and the Chief Medical Officer is to be at once informed of the fact by telegram.

All arrivals at Larnaca from any part of Rhodes are to be carefully inspected before being admitted to pratique, and for further security all persons wishing to land are to be carefully visited on the end of the pier, in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief Medical Officer.

In the event of any such person being found to be affected with small-pox, the said person, with his relations, friends, and servants accompanying him, if any, will be isolated in quarantine, and the Chief Medical Officer is to be immediately advised of the fact by telegram.
