In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 21st day of February, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Westcott, near Dorking, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, beginning at the occupation-road leading from Wolvers-lane to Logmore-lane, along Logmore-lane to an occupation-road to Durrants Farm (including the Farm buildings), thence along a footpath on the south-west side running to the south of Durrants Wood, Claypit Copse, and the Hazels to a Stone Bridge at the Pond Tail of Bury Hill, thence to the south to Logmore-lane along the path leading to Squires Farm (buildings included) and skirting Squires Wood to Wolvers-lane,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
