To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Society for the Encouragement of Arts, Manufactures, and Commerce, desire to offer Your Majesty our sincere congratulations on the completion of the Fiftieth Year of Your Majesty's auspicious reign, and to express our earnest hope that Your Majesty may yet for many years be permitted to receive the affectionate homage of Your people throughout Your great Empire.

Your Majesty is aware that this Society has during many successive years presented to persons who have rendered eminent services to Arts. Manufactures, and Commerce, a medal, named after that illustrious Prince whose enlightened patronage and far-seeing counsel so greatly helped and furthered all the objects which the Society was

founded to promote.

To the list of eminent persons whose services have entitled them to the award of the Albert Medal, the Society now wish to add the name of the Sovereign under whose just and beneficent sway all classes of Her subjects have been enabled to enjoy the advantages which the progress of Science and the Arts has afforded. We, therefore, humbly pray Your Majesty to permit us to mark this eventful year by offering the Albert Medal to Your Majesty, in commemoration of the advance of Arts, Manufactures, and Commerce throughout the Empire during the fifty years of Your Majesty's reign.

> Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, March 10, 1888.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 29th ultimo, from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, stating that in addition to the precautionary measures against the introduction of small-pox from Swedish ports on the Sound between Malmö and Landskrone, reported in Despatch No. 10, Commercial, of the 26th instant; the notice issued by the Danish Government on the 24th instant establishes quarantine against all arrivals from Italian ports in the Adriatic situated between Ortone and Bari, both ports inclusive, and against all vessels which have communicated on their voyage with others from the said ports, they being considered as infected with Asiatic cholera.

By the same notice the importation of linen, clothing and bedding which has been used, except passengers' luggage, rags, wadding (used), wool flock, paper refuse, hides, and hair from the above-named Swedish and Italian ports is forbidden.

The sanitary measures imposed on the 7th December, 1887, and the 4th January, 1888, on arrivals from Sicily and Sardinia, and from Italian ports situated between Cape Santa Maria de Leuca and the French frontier, and from Maltese ports, are, at the same time, rescinded.

The prohibition against rags, &c., from ports

in Paraguay, Urnguay, Sicily, Sardinia, the Argentine Republic, Malta, and the Continental ports of Italy between Cape Santa Maria de Leuca and Cape Miseno is abrogated.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic., c. 17). WHEREAS by Section 68 of the above-named Act, it is provided as follows:

TREASURY WARRANT.

Interpretation Clause.

1. In this Warrant the expression "Parcel" of his Commission. Dated 16th February, 1888. I means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

Places between which Parcels may be Transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post between the Colonies of the Gold Coast and Lagos.

Rates of Postage.

3. On all Parcels transmitted by Post under this Warrant, there shall be charged and paid the following rates of postage (that is to say):-

On every Parcel not exceeding one pound in

weight sixpence.

On every Parcel exceeding one pound and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, for the first pound sixpence, and for every additional pound, or fraction of a pound in weight, sixpence.

Provisions of other Warrants to apply.

4. Every such Parcel shall be subject to the provisions of the respective Warrants of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury relating to the Parcel Post between the United Kingdom and the Gold Coast and Lagos, so far as such provisions are applicable.

Commencement of Warrant.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
