In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intenis to make the presentation, of her inten-tion to be present, should accompany the pre-sentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's appro-bation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals). Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Middlesex, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence. the carcases of any pigs which have been buried recently on the premises in the occupation of Mr. C. J. Sanders, of the Royal English Sausage Casing Works, at Ashford, in the county of Mid-

dlesex, subject to the following conditions:

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a post-mortem examination to be made of the carcases with a view to ascertain the cause of death of such animals, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcases to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause them to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet

of earth.

2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, post-mortem examination, and re-burial of the carcases shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.

3. This Licence is revocable by the Privy C. L. Peel. Council.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act;

And whereas the said Henry Donald Gordon is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said Henry Donald Gordon accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows :-

ARTICLE 3.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE 4.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the duties and powers of any District Auditor acting under the authority of an Order or Orders issued by Us, with respect to the audit of the Accounts of the Authorities referred to in Article 2 of this Order, so far as regards any Audit already commenced by him, or any proceedings in relation thereto.
