## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Rooms, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the borough of Grantham,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Glasgow as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space in the port and burgh of Glasgow, being part of the wharf and depôt of the Trustees of the Clyde Navigation known as the Yorkhill Wharf, one portion of which space is situate on the south-east side of the Ferry-road, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the south-east side of the said Ferry-road where the same is intersected by the water-edge of the said Wharf; thence passing in a south-easterly direction for a distance of three hundred and seventy-seven feet six inches or thereabouts along the coping which forms the water-edge of the said Wharf; thence running north-east along a line at right angles to the said coping for a distance of fifty-four feet nine inches or thereabouts bounded by a wooden fence; thence passing in a south-easterly direction along a line at right angles to the last described boundary and parallel with the said coping for a distance of one hundred and thirty-nine feet or thereabouts; thence running north-east along a line at right angles to the last described boundary for a distance of thirty-four feet or thereabouts measuring along the outside wall of a brick building; thence running north-westward along a line at right angles to the last described boundary for a distance of thirty feet or thereabouts; thence running north-eastward along a line at right angles to the last described boundary for a distance of eighty-six feet or thereabouts to a point on the south-west side of the Pointhouse-road; thence passing in a north-westerly direction for a distance of four hundred and twenty-two feet or thereabouts along the south-west boundary of the said Pointhouse-road to a point where it meets the south-east boundary of the said Ferry-road; thence south-westward along the south-east boundary of the said Ferry-road for a distance of one hundred and eighty-six feet six inches or thereabouts to the point of departure first described; and the other portion of which space is situate on the south-west side of the said Pointhouse-road, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the south-west side of the said Pointhouse-road distant eight hundred and six feet or thereabouts south-east from the junction of the said Pointhouse-road with the said Ferry-road; thence passing in a south-westerly direction at right angles to the said Pointhouse-road for a distance of one hundred and nineteen feet eleven inches or thereabouts bounded by a wooden fence; thence running south-east along a wooden fence at right angles to the last described boundary for a distance of one hundred and thirty-seven feet two inches or thereabouts; thence running south-west along a wooden fence for a distance of fifty-five feet or thereabouts till it intersects the water-edge of the Wharf; thence in a south-easterly direction for a

distance of three hundred and eighty-six feet three inches or thereabouts along the coping which forms the water-edge of the said Wharf; thence in a north-easterly direction along a wooden fence at right angles to the last mentioned boundary for a distance of two hundred and three feet ten inches or thereabouts to a point on the south-west side of the said Pointhouse-road; thence passing in a north-westerly direction for a distance of five hundred and twenty-eight feet nine inches or thereabouts along the south-west boundary of the said Pointhouse-road to the point of departure first described: together with an overhead Gangway which connects the two portions of the space herein described, such Gangway being six hundred and seventy feet in length commencing at a point one hundred and eighty-eight feet westward from the extreme eastern boundary of the portion of the space first described, and terminating at a point one hundred and thirty feet eastward from the extreme western boundary of the portion of the space secondly described; all which space, consisting of such two portions and connecting Gangway, is coloured pink on the plan thereof deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council

Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the burgh of Glasgow.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Liverpool, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space at the Wallasey Dock, in the borough of Birkenhead, and the township of Poolton-cum-Seacombe, in the county of Chester, situate on the east and the north sides of the said dock, bounded by a line commencing on the Wallasey landing-stage at a point seventy-eight feet or thereabouts from the south-east corner of the said stage, thence running in a westwardly direction thirty-six feet or thereabouts, thence in an angular direction northwardly two hundred and ten feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly two hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts along the south side of the north bridge connecting the said landing-stage with the river wall, thence running in a straight line northwardly six hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts, thence in a north-westwardly direction ninety feet or thereabouts to the south-east corner of certain cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence in a straight line westwardly one thousand and eighty-three feet or thereabouts, thence northwardly for a distance of nine feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly for a distance of five hundred and eighty-six feet or thereabouts to a point near the south-west corner of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence northwardly for a distance of three hundred and eighteen feet or thereabouts along the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises to the

north-west corner of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence in an eastwardly and southwardly direction for a distance of five hundred and seventy feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly for a distance of forty-nine feet or thereabouts to the north-east corner of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence southwardly for a distance of nine hundred feet or thereabouts to or near the top of the said north bridge to the said stage, thence eastwardly two hundred and ten feet or thereabouts along the north side of the said north bridge connecting the said landing-stage with the river wall, thence eastwardly in an angular direction on the said landing-stage for a length of ninety-five feet or thereabouts, and thence southwardly along the eastern face of the said landing-stage for a length of two hundred and sixty-two feet or thereabouts to the point of commencement aforesaid near the south-east corner of the said landing-stage, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the borough of Birkenhead and township of Poolton-cum-Seacombe deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, copies of which are deposited at the offices of the Town Clerk of the borough of Birkenhead, and the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Chester.

# INTERNATIONAL COPYRIGHT ACT, 1886.

## NOTICE.

HAVING regard to the International Copyright Act of 1886, and to the Order in Council dated 28th day of November, 1887, issued in virtue thereof, and of previous International Copyright Acts, and in pursuance of the Copyright Convention of the 9th day of September, 1886, the ratifications whereof were exchanged on the 5th day of September, 1887, between Her Majesty and the contracting countries following, namely, Germany, Belgium, Spain, France, Hayti, Italy, Switzerland, and Tunis, by which order Copyright Owners in the said countries are to have, in the United Kingdom, as respects literary or artistic works, the same right of copyright as if the works had been first produced in the United Kingdom, and during the same period as, but not longer than that enjoyed in the country in which the work was first produced; the Commissioners of Customs are prepared to receive from, or on behalf of, owners of Copyright in books first produced in any of the said foreign countries "notice" in accordance with sections 42 and 44 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, accompanied by declaration, as required by the latter of these sections, upon the following conditions, viz. :—

1. The notice must give the title, and a facsimile of the title page of the book, with a statement added of the date when the copyright commenced in the Foreign Country, and of the exact day when it will expire.

2. The notice may be given by the copyright owner himself, or by an agent or representative for him in the United Kingdom. If given by the copyright owner the notice must state the name of an agent or representative in the United Kingdom to whom the Board of Customs can, if necessary, refer.

3. The date of the expiration of the copyright, as stated in the notice, will depend on the law of the Foreign Country, taken in conjunction with the law of copyright of the United Kingdom. The notice must be accompanied by evidence of the existence of the copyright in the Foreign Country and of its duration there, such evidence being similar to that prescribed by section 7 of the Act of 1886 above mentioned, with reference to proof of the existence of copyright in a foreign country; or, in other words, a certificate, verified as provided by the said section, to the effect that

the copyright exists, and that, according to the law of the said foreign country, it would continue until such and such a time.

4. The declaration must be made in the United Kingdom in accordance with the provisions of section 44 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876. If the notice is given by the copyright owner, and he is not himself in the United Kingdom, the declaration must be made by the agent or representative mentioned in the notice.
