THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Local Authority acting in and for the county of Aberdeen, dated the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—the byres on the farm of Adziel, in the parish of Strichen, occupied by Alexander Beddie, junior,—are hereby extended so as to include the Place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.
