

Church, Worthing, and of the said parish of Broadwater, which said portions are described in the schedule hereunder written, and together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Andrew, Worthing.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district, and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, then of such new parish, shall be permanently endowed in manner hereinbefore specified.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district, and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, then of the said new parish, and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised for one turn, and that the first turn only, by the said George Wedd his heirs and assigns, and that all the residue and remaining turns of the said right of patronage and nomination shall in like manner be assigned to and become and be vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Warden Council and Scholars of Keble College in the University of Oxford and their successors and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Andrew, Worthing, comprising:—

"All that portion of the consolidated chapelry or new parish of the Holy Trinity Worthing in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester, together with all that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Christ Church, Worthing, in the same county and diocese and together with all that portion of the parish of Broadwater in the county and diocese aforesaid wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, all which said portions are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry or new parish of the Holy Trinity Worthing from the parish of Broadwater aforesaid at a point near the western end of the Worthing Station of the London Brighton and South Coast line of railway and extending thence westward along the said boundary, thereby following the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to the point where the same line crosses over South Farm-lane and extending thence that is from the said boundary southward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the point where it joins

Tarring-road, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of fourteen yards or thereabouts to its junction with Clifton-road and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Elizabeth-road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Victoria-road, that is to the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry or new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worthing, from the new parish of Christ Church, Worthing aforesaid, and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary, thereby following the middle of the said Victoria-road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the junction of such road with Cambridge-road and extending thence, that is, from the last-mentioned boundary, eastward along the middle of Cambridge-road aforesaid for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Christ Church-road and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with Wenban-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chapel-road that is to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church Worthing from the parish of Broadwater aforesaid and extending thence northward along the last-described boundary, thereby following the middle of Chapel-road aforesaid, for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the junction of Chapel-road with Teville-road and with the Broadwater-road, and extending thence that is from the last-described boundary still northward along the middle of the Broadwater-road aforesaid for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same road with Newland-road, which boundary divides the said parish of Broadwater from the district chapelry of Saint George Worthing in the county and diocese aforesaid and continuing thence still northward along the last-described boundary for a distance of six and three quarter chains or thereabouts, thereby still continuing along the middle of the Broadwater-road aforesaid, to the centre of the bridge which carries such road over the London, Brighton, and South Coast line of railway aforesaid, and extending thence westward from the last-mentioned boundary along the middle of the same line of railway for a distance of twelve and three quarter chains or thereabouts to the first described point at or near to the western end of the Worthing Railway Station at which point the said imaginary line commenced as aforesaid."

WHEREAS Charles Neve Cresswell, Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as Commissioner for the purpose of preparing a scheme for determining the boundaries of the wards of the borough of Kidderminster, and for apportioning the Councillors thereto, has transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his scheme in the following terms:—
