NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 127 of the year 1888.)

ENGLAND—SOUTH COAST.—ISLE OF WIGHT.

(1.) *St. Catherine Point—Alterations in Character of Light and Fog Signal.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 84 (1), of 23rd March, 1888, and previous notices, on intended alterations in character of the light and fog signal on St. Catherine Point :—

The Trinity House, London, has given further notice, dated 5th May, 1888, that the alterations have been carried out :—

The light is an electric flashing white light, showing a flash of about five seconds' duration every thirty seconds.

Also, that during thick or foggy weather, the fog siren will give two blasts (a high note followed by a low note) in quick succession every minute.

NOTE.—In approaching from the westward, the light will now be visible inshore of the bearing of S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., whilst the strong glare of the light may at times extend right in to the land. Mariners are therefore cautioned that when within five miles of the light, it should not be brought to bear to the southward of S.E. by E.

(2.) *Needles—Alterations in Character and Colour of Light.*

Also, with reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 84 (2) of 23rd March, 1888, and previous notices, on intended alterations in character and colour of Needles Light :—

Has given further notice, dated 5th May, 1888, that coincidently with the alterations in St. Catherine's Light, the alterations in the Needles Light have been carried out :—

The light is an occulting light, with an occultation once every minute, instead of once every half-minute as previously.

The arc of red light between the bearings of E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. and N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., is changed to white light, so that the light now shows white between the bearings of E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., through north, and N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. From the bearing of N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. to the land, where the light was previously obscured, it is now visible as a red light. In other respects the light is unchanged.

[The bearings are magnetic, and are given from seaward. Variation 18° Westerly in 1888.]

SOUTH AMERICA—EAST COAST.

PATAGONIA—NUEVO GULF.

Unsuccessful Search for Gulf of St. Vincent Shoal, and Shoal Ground Found Eastward of Port Madryn.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 1, of 2nd January, 1888, on the Commander of the steam-vessel "Gulf of St. Vincent" having reported the existence of a sand bank, on which that vessel struck, with a least depth of $2\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms, situated in the approach to Port Madryn, and on the southern side of Nuevo Gulf, eastern coast of Patagonia:—

The following information, relative to the existence of shoal ground eastward of Port Madryn, is derived from an examination made by Commander Henry C. Bigge, Her Majesty's ship "Flamingo," on 7th and 9th March, 1888:—

The "Flamingo" examined a shoal about 3 miles eastward of Port Madryn, and extending along the shore nearly 2 miles from east point (the point next eastward of Cave Bluff), to the next point again to the eastward, which has been named Shoal Bluff. On this shoal a depth of $2\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms was obtained, with east point bearing south, distant about one mile; depths of 4 and 5 fathoms being found on the apparent edge of the shoal ground to the eastward. The eastward part of the shoal ground was sounded over, the least water obtained being a depth of $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, situated with east point bearing S. 65° W., distant about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles; from that position soundings of 4 to 7 fathoms were found for a distance of half a mile eastward and northward.

Position, $2\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms, on Admiralty Chart, lat. $42^\circ 46'$ S., long. $61^\circ 54' 30''$ W.

Position, $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, on Admiralty Chart, lat. $42^\circ 46' 45''$ S., long. $61^\circ 52' 45''$ W.

Commander Bigge reports, that from the appearance of all the points on the south shore of Nuevo Gulf, it is probable that banks stretch off them, and that ships should give that shore a wide berth until it is properly surveyed.

The reported position of the shoal (East Point bearing W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., distant 6 miles), on which the "Gulf of St. Vincent" struck, was examined, but no indication of shoal water could be obtained, as however, this examination was not very minute, the Gulf of St. Vincent Shoal is retained on the charts for the present, although it seems probable that the bank on which that vessel struck is that found by the "Flamingo."

London Tramways (Various Powers) Bill.

(Alteration in Works.)
