

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 23rd day of May, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the parish of Winston, in the county of Suffolk, as lies within the following boundary, that is to say, on the west and south by a lane leading from Pettaugh to Mickfield Water-run called Winston Head-lane, thence on the east to a footpath leading to Mr. Hawkins' residence on Winston Little Green, and on the north by a lane and private-road to Mr. Hawkins' Off Farm called Bush Farm, and thence in a straight line to Mickfield Water-run as aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

The following Place (namely),—in the county of Fife comprising the cow-byre situate at the south-west corner of the farm steading of Rires, in the parish of Kilconquhar, and occupation of the Trustees of the late James Seth, Esquire, together with the loose-box situate at the south end of the stable forming part of the said steading of Rires,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Local Authority acting in and for the county of Aberdeen, dated the fourteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—the byres and all the grassfields with the exception of the fields of first year's grass on the Farm of Easter Selby, in the parish of Keithhall, occupied by Adam Mitchell,—are hereby contracted or altered so as only to include the Place as described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place so described in the Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order be deemed to be the Place declared by the said order of the Local Authority to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

A Place comprising the byres and the grass fields numbered 185 and 244 on the Ordnance Survey Plan, with the requisite access thereto, on the Farm of Easter Selby, in the parish of Keithhall, in the county of Aberdeen, occupied by Adam Mitchell.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the eighth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, prohibiting the landing in England or Wales or Scotland of animals brought from the port of Flushing in the Kingdom of the Netherlands: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
