Sunken Rock Westward of Cape Palmas.

INFORMATION has been received from the Commander-in-Chief on the Cape of Good Hope Station that Commander Annesley, H.M.S. "Icarus," has reported that there is a rock in the approach to the anchorage westward of Cape Palmas :-

. This rock (Congo Rock) is of small extent and pyramidal in shape, having a depth of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms on it, with 5 fathoms close around, and 7 fathoms a quarter of a cable off. It is situated with Cape Palmas Lighthouse bearing S. 65° E., distant 114 cables.

Position, lat. 4° 22′ 15" N., long. 7° 45′ 25" W. Also, a can buoy, painted red, is moored N.W. by N., distant half a cable from this rock.

It is probable that the rock now found is that reported by the African Steam Navigation Company's vessels "Congo" in 1875, and "Volta" in 1879; and which was searched for unsuccessfully by H.M.S. "Firefly" in 1879," though it lies further to the northward than the position given by either of those vessels. It has therefore been named Congo Rock in the Admiralty Charts.

CEYLON-SOUTH EAST COAST.

Admiralty Charts-Nos. 813 and 2031.

THE attention of Mariners is called to the new editions of Admiralty Charts, Nos. 813 and 2031, giving the results of the re-survey of the south-eastern coasts of Ceylon from the Little Basses to Trincomali, by the Officers of H.M.S. "Egeria," under the command of Captain P. Aldrich, 1887.

The offshore soundings now given are of such a nature as to render navigation perfectly safe in the thickest weather, if the lead is attended to, and the ship is not allowed to come into less than 20 fathoms of water.

The disasters which have taken place from time to time on this coast, supposed to have been on dangers situated some miles from the shore, were probably due to difficulties in fixing the true position; difficulties caused by the absence of soundings, and also by the fact that some of the mountain peaks in the interior, used as landmarks, were not in their true positions on the former charts, an inaccuracy now remedied from the trigonometrical survey of Ceylon, carried out by the Surveyor-General of that Colony.

Charts, Nos. 828 and 70, will be shortly cor-

rected for this new information.

London Tramways (Various Powers) Bill.

(Alteration in Works.)
