By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

that sanitary precautions will be adopted against arrivals from the port of Egersund, in Norway; that the usual prohibitory order against the importation of linen, &c., from this port is also issued; that sanitary precautions against Swedish ports situated between Malmö and Landshrona are dispensed with; and that the other sanitary and quarantine regulations remain as reported in the Gazette of the 18th April.
