REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is

Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Fife, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcass of a certain head of cattle recently slaughtered and buried on the premises in the occupation of Mr. Cheape, at Kippo Farm, in the parish of Kingsbarns, in the county of Fife, subject to the following conditions:

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcass to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the animal was affected with a contagious or infectious disease and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcass to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause it to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.
2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcass shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.
3. This Licence is revocable by the Privy Council.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Local Authority acting in and for the county of Warwick, dated the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be a Place infected with swine-fever (namely),—the pig-stys at the rear of the Weavers Arms Public House in the occupation of Andrew Bull, and the house, butcher's-shop, pig-stys, and other buildings, and yard adjoining, in the occupation of Josiah Buckler, both situate in Abbey-street, in the parish of Nuneaton, in the Atherstone Division of the county of Warwick,—are hereby contracted or altered so as to include the Place as described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place so described in the Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order be deemed to be the Place declared by the said order of the Local Authority to be a Place infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Berlin a copy of the Central and District Official Gazette for Alsace-Lorraine of the 22nd instant, of which the following is an extract in translation:—

"On and after Thursday, the 31st of May, 1888, all foreigners without distinction crossing the French frontier, whether they are passing through, or intend to take up their residence in the country, must be in possession of a passport which has been viséd at the German Embassy at Paris. The visa must not be older than one year.

"License cards for foreign commercial travellers do not take the place of the requisite passport.

"Foreigners who are not in possession of a regular passport are not to be allowed to proceed on their journeys, and if necessary are to be re-conducted across the frontier."

Fardell and Company, and so much of the roadway or space as lies between the water edge of the said Basin and such Iron Shed.

And do hereby prescribe as follows;

1. When landed the animals shall forthwith be placed in the said Galvanized Iron Shed and shall be there kept until moved thereout in accordance with the regulations contained in Article 144 of The Animals Order of 1886.

2. When and so soon as an Inspector of the Privy Council shall have certified in writing that all parts of the Quarantine Station with which the animals or their droppings have come in contact in their passage to the said Galvanized Iron Shed have been cleansed and disinfected to his satisfaction, all parts of the space above defined, other than the said Shed, shall cease to be included in the Quarantine Station, and thereupon, for the purposes of this Order, the said Galvanized Iron Shed shall alone be deemed to be the Quarantine Station hereby defined.
