CIVIL UNIFORM.

THE Queen has been pleased to sanction an Undress Cloak and Cap to be worn with the Civil Uniform worn by Her Majesty's Household and the Diplomatic and Civil Services, and Consular Service.

Description.

CLOAK AND CAPE.

Blue cloth of any substance, double breasted, lined scarlet, to reach within a foot of the ground, stand and fall black velvet collar, two rows of buttons in front, six in each row, and six inches apart across; blue cloth strap behind, with a large button at each end; blue cloth cape lined black, with four small buttons down front, and to button on to collar of cloak; gilt hook and chain; buttons of the pattern worn upon the undress uniform of the Class and Service.

The Cloak and Cape may be worn together or separately.

CAP.

Blue cloth made up soft, with a small gold braided top and a row of gold braid round the crown, and a row top and bottom of a black 1½-inch oak-leaf band, small button at side, and a plain blue cloth peak.

Cap for Household, same, with scarlet welts in

place of gold braid.

Cap for Consular Service, same, with silver welts in place of gold braid.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and imme-

diately after the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

SCHEDULE.

An Area at Bearsted, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at a point at the south-east corner of Vintners Park known as Huntsmanslane, along the high-road to the corner by Gidds Pond, thence to the White Horse Bearsted, thence to the Kentish Yeoman Bearsted, and thence by the Ashford main-road to the corner of the said Huntsmans-lane; the whole of the high-roads adjoining such area being included in the Area.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of the following part of the Port of Plymouth as a Landing-Place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine:

All that space in the Harbour of Sutton Pool, Plymouth, being the southern portion of the Timber Jetty known as Sutton Jetty, and projecting into such Harbour from the southern end of Sutton Wharf and at right angles to the wharf known as Vauxhall Quay, included within a boundary line commencing at a point at the water edge of the Jetty on its eastern side one hundred and thirty-five feet or thereabouts from the point where the Jetty adjoins the said Vauxhall Quay and Sutton Wharf, thence in a southerly direction along the eastern face of the Jetty to the end of such Jetty being a distance of thirty-six feet or thereabouts, then along the end or southern face of the Jetty westwards for a distance of thirty-four feet six inches or thereabouts, thence in a northerly direction parallel with the western face of the Jetty for a distance of twenty-seven feet and six inches or thereabouts, thence in an easterly direction twenty-

four feet or thereabouts, thence in a northerly direction eight feet six inches or thereabouts, and thence in an easterly direction eleven feet or thereabouts terminating at the first point mentioned, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of the said Landing-Place deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk for the borough of Plymouth.
