By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Declarations described in the Schedule to this Order, made by the Local Authority of the county of Fife, declaring the existence of pleuro-pneumonia at the places therein mentioned, are hereby cancelled, and each of the Infected Places thereby declared shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 4th ultimo, from Her Majesty's Consul at Callao, enclosing the following copy of a Decree recently issued by the Peruvian Government respecting the re-opening of Peruvian ports to ships from Chili:—

1. Vessels proceeding from the Atlantic with clean bills of health bound to Peru will be received at ports on the coast without previous quarantine, provided that in passing along the coast of Chili they do not touch at places except those where no cases of cholera have occurred.

2. The same vessels when they call at ports where the epidemic has terminated will be received with quarantine of observation, and previous disinfection, providing that during the voyage there has been no case of cholera on board.

3. Vessels proceeding from Chilian ports in which the epidemic has not existed, and which before undertaking the voyage have not traded at infected ports, will be also received in the same

manner as those from the Atlantic, as expressed in Art. I. of this resolution.

4. Vessels coming from Chilian ports at which the epidemic has been extinguished, but which had been under its influence for some time, can only be admitted on the Peruvian coast when they have been disinfected, before starting, which act must be verified by a certificate by the Medical Officer on board, having likewise to submit on their arrival to a quarantine of (5) five days at the least and undergo another disinfection before being placed in free pratique.

5. Passengers and European merchandize coming from Africa and Chilian ports not infected, will be received freely.

6. Passengers and goods proceeding from Chilian ports in which the cholera has been recently extinguished, must be subject in Peruvian ports to the same regulations as applicable to ships referred to in Art. IV.

7. Vessels proceeding from infected Chilian ports will not at present be received at ports of the Republic; the ships comprised in this disposition being those proceeding from the zone situated to the north of Valparaíso as far as Antofagasta, excluding those two ports.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. All Treasury Warrants at any time heretofore made relating to the conveyance by post of postal packets (which term in this Warrant means and includes all letters, post cards, reply post cards, newspapers, packets of commercial papers, packets of printed papers, and pattern or sample packets) between the United Kingdom and the Marshall Islands, and also between any British Colony or Foreign Country and the Marshall Islands, are hereby annulled to the extent to which such Warrants respectively relate to the several matters comprised in this Warrant, as aforesaid.

2. The rates of postage and additional sum for registration now chargeable and payable by the authority of the Treasury Warrants of the 29th day of May, 1879, the 14th day of January, 1880, the 15th day of June, 1880, and the 9th day of March, 1886, or any one of them, on postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to New Caledonia, to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of the said Warrants, or any one of them, and all regulations and conditions now in force as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post between New Caledonia and any other country or place as aforesaid, shall extend and apply to all postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to the Marshall Islands to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of the said Warrants, in the same way as if the Marshall Islands had been named or referred to in the said Warrants and the schedules thereunder written, in the same manner as New Caledonia is named or referred to therein.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
