(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 16th day of June, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Declarations described in the Schedule to this Order, made by the Local Authority of the county of Fife, declaring the existence of pleuro-pneumonia at the places therein mentioned, are hereby cancelled, and each of the Infected Places thereby declared shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
