THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 28th May last, from Her Majesty's Representative at Quito, stating that in consequence of the almost total cessation of cholera in Chili the Sanitary Board of Guayaquil, on the 16th instant, declared that vessels proceeding from Chilian ports with clean bills of health, and touching at Peruvian ports, shall be admitted at Guayaquil; but that vessels arriving direct from Chilian ports shall be subjected to a quarantine of observation varying between forty-eight hours and five days.
