1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the parish of Kenilworth, in the county of Warwick,— which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. In accordance with the provisions contained in Article 99 of The Animals Order of 1886, every Local Authority in England and Wales and Scotland is hereby authorized to make, from time to time during the continuance of this Order, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of swine-fever, such Regulations as to the Local Authority seem expedient for prohibiting or regulating the exposure or sale of swine in or at any Market, Fair, Auction, Sale-yard, Sale, or Exhibition within their District (not being within the limits of a Swine-Fever Infected Area), subject however and according to the conditions, provisions, and regulations applicable thereto under The Animals Order of 1886.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and shall cease to operate from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine; and all Regulations made under this Order shall be expressed accordingly to terminate not later than at such latter date.

3.—(1.) Every Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Privy Council a copy of every Regulation made by them under the authority of this Order.

(2.) If the Privy Council are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under the authority of this Order that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct

the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.
