

that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Luke West Holloway, and of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Islington should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Matthias situate in the Caledonian-road as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick Bishop of the said diocese of London, as such Bishop, and with the consents of the Reverend Lewis Borrett White of number sixty-seven Queen-street in the city of London, Clerk in Holy Orders, of the Reverend John Hurst of Saint Mark's Vicarage Tollington Park, in the said county of Middlesex, Clerk in Holy Orders, of the Reverend Walter Sunderland Lewis of number seventy-one Hornsey-rise in the said county, Clerk in Holy Orders, of Thomas Wall of number seven Highbury-grange, in the same county Merchant, and of William Edwards of number sixty-six Saint Mark's-road, North Kensington, in the same county, Gentleman, the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Luke, West Holloway and with the consent of the Reverend William Edward Haigh, Clerk in Holy Orders, the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Islington in the said diocese of London, and as such vicar or incumbent, the patron of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint Andrew Islington aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Luke West Holloway, and of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Islington which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Matthias situate in the Caledonian-road as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthias, Caledonian-road, Islington.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthias, Caledonian-road, Islington comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Luke West Holloway in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, which is bounded upon the west by the parish of Saint Paul Camden New Town upon the south by the hereinafter-described portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Andrew Islington, and upon the east partly by the new parish of Saint Clement Barnsbury partly by the new parish of Saint David, West Holloway and partly by the new parish of Saint James (Lower Holloway) all in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the lastly-named new parish from the new parish of Saint Luke West Holloway aforesaid, at the point where the Caledonian-road is joined by Hillmarton-road and

by the North-road which leads to and along the north-western side of the Metropolitan Cattle Market, and extending thence that is from the Caledonian-road aforesaid, south-westward along the middle of the said North-road for a distance of thirty-five chains or thereabouts to its junction, at the north-western entrance to the said market, with Brecknock-road, and continuing thence still south-westward and in a direct line across the last-named road to the boundary on the western side of the same road which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint Luke West Holloway from the parish of Saint Paul Camden New Town aforesaid.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Islington which is bounded upon the east by the new parish of Saint Clement Barnsbury aforesaid, upon the north by the hereinafter-described portion of the new parish of Saint Luke, West Holloway aforesaid, upon the west partly by the parish of Saint Paul Camden New Town aforesaid and partly by the parish of Saint Thomas, Agar Town, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south partly by the new parish of Saint Michael Islington in the said county and diocese, and partly by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named new parish from the new parish of Saint Andrew Islington aforesaid, at the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the North London Railway over the line of the Great Northern Railway, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the line of the North London Railway aforesaid for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the centre of the bridge which carries the same line of railway over the Caledonian-road aforesaid, which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew Islington from the new parish of Saint Clement Barnsbury aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:—
