

Privy Council Office, August 10, 1888.

THE following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Trinity College, Cambridge, on the twentieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and sealed with the Common Seal of the College, on the nineteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

Statutes to add to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (40 and 41 Vict. c. 48) in relation to Trinity College in the University of Cambridge duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the twentieth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight and passed at such Meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting (there being then present the Master and more than twenty-five Fellows) and submitted for the approval of Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

WE the Master Fellows and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act alter and amend the Statutes framed by the said Commissioners in relation to our said College in the following manner:—

By substituting for § 2 of Statute XII the following section to form an amended § 2 of the same Statute:—

§ 2. The vacant Fellowships or so many of them as shall not be filled up under any of the titles (β) (γ) (δ) or (ε) temporarily suspended under the provision in that behalf hereinbefore contained shall be filled up (α) from among Members of the College (and if in any year the Council shall so think fit, other Members of the University) as next hereinafter provided (that is to say) any Member of the College (or other Member of the University who shall have been admitted to the title of Bachelor Designate in Arts or to some equal title shall be eligible at each or any of the three annual elections taking place or which might have taken place next after the end of three years and six months from the beginning of the term in which he commenced residence. Provided however that if a Member of the College has been by illness or other grave cause prevented from proceeding to a degree at the regular time the Council if they think fit may prolong in his case the said period of three years and six months so as to make him eligible at each or any of the three annual elections next after the time when he shall have been admitted to the title of Bachelor Designate in Arts or to some equal title.

By adding to Statute XII the following section to precede § 3 and to form § 2a of the same Statute:—

§ 2a. The foregoing § 2 of Statute XII shall take effect from and after the approval thereof by Her Majesty in Council but so as not thereby to preclude any person who shall be then a Member of the College from becoming a Candidate at any annual election at which but for such alteration of Statute XII he might have been a Candidate nor in any case to enable such person to be a

Candidate at more than three annual elections or otherwise than at three successive annual elections.

By substituting for § 2 of Statute XX the following section to form an amended § 2 of the same Statute:—

§ 2. The election to the major Scholarships shall take place on the Monday after Easter week or on such other day as may be fixed by the Council. All the major Scholarships which are vacant on the day of election shall then be filled up and if the election take place less than six months before the time when such Scholarships are ordinarily vacated by lapse of time then as many more persons as the Council shall think fit shall be elected to the major Scholarships provided that such additional persons shall not exceed in number the major Scholarships which will be necessarily vacated when such Scholarships are so ordinarily vacated.
