THE following Charter has been granted to the Imperial British East Africa Company upon a Petition to Her Majesty in Council:

VICTORIA by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

To all whom these presents shall come,

Greeting:

WHEREAS a Humble Petition has been presented to Us in our Council by William Mackinnon, of Loup and Balinakill, in the county of Argyll, Scotland; The Right Honourable Lord Brassey, Knight, Commander of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, of Normanhurst Court, Sussex; General Sir Donald Stewart, Baronet Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, and a Companion of Our Most Star of India, and a Companion of Our Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, of Harrington-gardens, London; Sir John Kirk, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, of Wavertree, Sevenoaks, Kent; William Burdett-Coutts, a Member of the Commons House of Parliament, of Helly Lodge Higherte Middlessy, Robert of Holly Lodge, Highgate, Middlesex; Robert Palmer Harding, of Wetherby-gardens, Ken-sington, Esquire; George Sutherland Mackenzie, of 13, Austin Friars, London, Merchant.

And whereas the said Petition states amongst

other things :-

That the Petitioners and others are associated for the purpose of forming a Company or Association, to be incorporated, if to Us should seem fit, for the objects in the said Petition set forth under the corporate name of the Imperial British East Africa Company.

That His Highness the Sayyid Barghash Bin-Said, Sultan of Zanzibar and its East African Dependencies, by his grants or concessions dated the 24th May, 1887, granted and conceded to the Petitioners, or some of them, under the name or description of the British East African Association, all his powers, and the rights and duties of administration, and other privileges specially named on the mainland of East Africa, in the Territory of the Mrima, and also on the Islands embraced in such territory, and in all his Territories and Dependencies on the Coast of East Africa, from Wanga to Kipini, both inclusive, such powers, rights, and duties, to be exercised and performed in his name and under his flag, and subject to the provisions of the said grants and concessions.

That divers preliminary agreements have been made on behalf of the Petitioners with Chiefs and Tribes in regions which adjoin or are situate to the landward of the territories included in the said grants or concessions, and which are included in the sphere of British influence, agreed on behalf of Ourselves and the Government of His Majesty the Emperor of Germany, in 1886, by which powers of government and administration in such regions are granted or conceded to or for the benefit of the Petitioners.

That the Petitioners desire to carry into effect the said grants, concessions, and agreements, and such other grants, concessions, agreements, and treaties as they may hereafter obtain within the districts already referred to as being within the sphere reserved for British influence, and elsewhere, as We may be pleased to allow with the view of promoting trade, commerce, and good government in the territories and regions which are or may be comprised in such grants, concessions, agreements, or treaties, as aforesaid, and the Petitioners believe that, if the said grants, concessions, agreements, or treaties can be carried into effect, the condition of the natives inhabiting the aforesaid territories and regions would be materially improved, and their civilization advanced, and an organization established, which would tend to the suppression of the slave trade in such territories, and the said territories and regions would be opened to the lawful trade and commerce of Our subjects and of other nations.

That the possession by a British Company of the coast-line, as above defined, and which includes the Port of Mombassa, would be advantageous to the commercial and other interests of Our subjects in the Indian Ocean, who may otherwise become compelled to reside and trade under the government

or protection of alien powers.

That the success of the enterprise in which the Petitioners are engaged would be greatly advanced if it should seem fit to Us to grant them Our Reyal Charter of Incorporation as a British Company under the said name or title, or such other name or title, and with such powers as to Us may seem fit for the purpose of more effectually carrying out the objects aforesaid.

That the Petitioners have already subscribed large sums of money for the purposes of the intended Company, and are prepared to subscribe or to procure such further amount as may hereafter be found requisite for the development of the said enterprise in the event of Our being pleased to grant to them our Royal Charter of Incorporation as aforesaid.

Now, therefore, We having taken the said Petition into Our Royal consideration in Our Council, and being satisfied that the intentions of the Petitioners are praiseworthy and deserve encouragement, and that the enterprise in the Petition described may be productive of the benefits set forth in the said Petition by Our prerogative Royal, and of our especial grace, certain knowledge and mere motion have constituted, erected, and incorporated, and by this Our Charter for Us and Our heirs and Royal successors do constitute, erect, and incorporate into one body politic and corporate by the name of The Imperial British East Africa Company the said William Mackinnon, The Right Honourable Lord Brassey, K.C.B., General Sir Donald Stewart, Bart., G.C.B., G.C.S.I., C.I.E.; Sir John Kirk, G.C.M.G.; William Burdett-Coutts, M.P.; Robert Palmer Harding; George Sutherland Mackenzie; and such other persons and such bodies as from time to time become and are members of that body, with perpetual succession and a common Seal, with power to break, alter, or renew the same at discretion, and with the further authorities, powers, and privileges conferred, and subject to the conditions imposed by this Our Charter, and We do hereby accordingly will, ordain, grant,

and declare as follows (that is to say):—

1. The said Imperial British East Africa Company (in this Our Charter referred to as "the Company") is hereby authorized and empowered to hold and retain the full benefit of the several Grants, Concessions, Agreements, and Treaties aforesaid, or any of them, and all rights, interests, authorities, and powers necessary for the purposes of government, preservation of public order in, or protection of the said territories, or otherwise, of what nature or kind soever, under or by virtue thereof, or resulting therefrom, and ceded to or vested in the Company, in, over, or affecting the territories, lands, and property comprised in those several grants, concessions, agreements, or treaties, or in, over, or affecting any territories, lands, or property in the neighbourhood of the same, and to hold, use, and exercise the same lands, property, rights, interests, authorities, and powers respectively for the purposes of the Company, and on the terms of this our

Charter.

2. The Company is hereby further authorised and empowered, subject to the approval of one of our principal Secretaries of State (herein referred to as our Secretary of State) to acquire and take by any grant, concession, agreement, or treaty, other rights, interests, authorities, or powers of any kind or nature whatever in, over, or affecting the territories, lands, or property comprised in the several grants, concessions, agreements, or treaties as aforesaid, or any rights, interests, authorities, or powers of any kind or nature whatever in, over, or affecting other territories, lands, or property in Africa, and to hold, use, enjoy, and exercise the same for the purposes of the Company and on the terms of this our Charter.

© 3. Provided that none of the powers of this Our Charter shall be exercised under or in relation to any grant, concession, agreement, or treaty as aforesaid, until a copy of such grant, concession, agreement or treaty in such form and

with such maps or particulars as Our Secretary of State approves and verified as he requires, has been transmitted to him, and he has signified his approval thereof, either absolutely or subject to any conditions or reservations

to any conditions or reservations.

4. The Company shall be bound by and shall fulfil all and singular the stipulations on their part contained in any such grant, concession, agreement, or treaty, as aforesaid, subject to any subsequent agreement affecting those stipulations approved by our Secretary of State.

5. The Company shall always be and remain British in character and domicile, and shall have its principal office in Great Britain, and the Company's principal representative in East Africa, and all the Directors shall always be natural born British subjects or persons who have been naturalized as British subjects by or under an Act of Parliament of our United Kingdom.

6. The Company shall not have power to ransfer wholly or in part the benefit of the grants, concessions, agreements, or treaties aforesaid, or any of them, except with the consent

of our Secretary of State.

7. In case at any time any difference arises between the Sultan of Zanzibar, or the Chiefs or Tribes which are included in the sphere of British influence, as hereinbefore recited, and the Company, that difference shall on the part of the Company be submitted to the decision of our Secretary of State, if he is willing to undertake the decision thereof.

8. If at any time our Secretary of State thinks fit to dissent from or object to any of the dealings of the Company with any foreign power and to make known to the Company any suggestion founded on that dissent or objection, the Company shall act in accordance therewith.

9. If at any time Our Secretary of State thinks fit to object to the exercise by the Company of any authority or power within any part of the territories comprised in the several grants, concessions, agreements, or treaties aforesaid, or otherwise acquired by the Company, on the ground of there being an adverse claim to that part, the Company shall defer to that objection until such time as any such claim has been withdrawn or finally dealt with or settled by Our Secretary of State.

10. The Company shall, to the best of its power, discourage, and, so far as may be practicable and as may be consistent with existing treaties between non-African powers and Zanzibar, abolish by degrees any system of slave trade or domestic servitude in the Company's

territories.

11. The Company as such, or its officers as such, shall not in any way interfere with the religion of any class or tribe of the peoples of its territories or of any of the inhabitants thereof, except so far as may be necessary in the interests of humanity, and all forms of religious worship or religious ordinances may be exercised within the said territories, and no hindrance shall be offered thereto except as aforesaid.

- 12. In the administration of justice by the Company to the peoples of its territories or to any of the inhabitants thereof, careful regard shall always be had to the customs and laws of the class or tribe or nation to which the parties respectively belong, especially with respect to the holding, possession, transfer, and disposition of lands and goods, and testate or intestate succession thereto, and marriage, divorce, and legitimacy, and other rights of property and personal rights.

13. If at any time Our Secretary of State thinks fit to dissent from or object to any part of the proceedings or system of the Company

relative to the peoples of its territories or to any of the inhabitants in respect of slavery or religion, or the administration of justice or other matter, he shall make known to the Company his dissent or objection, and the Company shall act in accordance with his directions duly signified.

14. The Company shall freely afford all facilities requisite for Our ships in the harbours of the Company without payment, except reasonable charges for work done or services rendered, or

materials or things supplied.

15. Except in the Dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar (within which it is required to use His Highness' Flag) the Company may hoist and use on its buildings and elsewhere in its territories, and on its vessels such distinctive flag indicating the British character of the Company as Our Secretary of State and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty shall from time to time approve.

16. Nothing in this Our Charter shall be deemed to authorise the Company to set up or grant any monopoly of trade, provided that the establishment of or the grant of concessions for banks, railways, tramways, docks, telegraphs, water-works, or other similar undertakings, or any undertakings or system of patent or copyright approved by Our Secretary of State, shall not be

deemed monopolies for this purpose.

17. Subject to the Customs' duties, and taxes, hereby authorised, and subject to such restrictions as may be imposed by the Company on importation of spirits, opium, arms, and ammunition, and to restrictions on other things similar to those restrictions which may be applied in Our United Kingdom, or in Our Indian Empire, or as may be approved by Our Secretary of State, there shall be no differential treatment of the subjects of any power as to trade or settlement, or as to access to markets; provided that foreigners as well as British subjects shall be subject to administrative dispositions in the interest of commerce and of order.

18. The Company shall in Zanzibar territory conform to all the restrictions and provisions with respect to export and import, or other duties or taxes, which are contained in any Treaty for the time being in force between Zanzibar and any other power in relation to the Zanzibar territories of the Company.

19. The Company shall not in Zanzibar territory levy on foreigners any other duty or taxes than such as are authorised in Zanzibar territory by such treaties as last mentioned, and shall not in their other territories, without the approval of Our Secretary of State, levy on foreigners any duties or taxes, other than duties and taxes similar to those authorized to be levied in Zanzibar territory by the treaties in force between Us, and the Sultan of Zanzibar at the date of this Our Charter, and if any such other taxes are levied with the approval of our Secretary of State, accounts of their nature, incidence, proceeds, and application shall from time to time if required be furnished to Our Secretary of State at such times and in such form, and in such manner as he

20. For the more effectual prevention of the slave trade the Company may, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, levy within the territories administered by the Company, other than their Zanzibar territory, a tax on caravans and porters, or carriers carrying merchandise or other goods passing through the Company's territories, provided such tax shall not be imposed in contravention of any treaties between

Great Britain and Zanzibar.

21. For regulating the hunting of elephants, and for their preservation, for the purpose of

providing means of military and other transport in Our Indian Empire or elsewhere, the Company may, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore coutained, impose and levy within any territories administered by them, other than their Zanzibar territory, a license duty and may grant licences to take or kill elephants, or to export elephants' tusks or ivory.

22. The Company shall be subject to and shall perform and undertake all the obligations contained in or undertaken by Ourselves under any treaty, agreement, or arrangement between Ourselves and any other State or Power, whether

already made or hereafter to be made.

In all matters relating to the observance of this Article, or to the exercise within the Company's Territories for the time being, of any jurisdiction exercisable by Us under the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, the Company shall conform to and observe and carry out all such directions as may from time to time be given in that behalf by our Secretary of State, and the Company shall appoint all necessary officers to perform such duties and shall provide such Courts and other requisites as may from time to time be necessary for the administration of Justice.

23. The Company is hereby further specially authorised and empowered for the purposes of

this Our Charter-

(r.) To fix the capital of the Company and to increase the same from time to time and for the purpose of raising such sums of money as it may find necessary for the proper working of the Company as the field of its operations extend, to issue shares and to borrow monies by debentures or other obligations.

(II.) To acquire and hold, or charter, or otherwise deal with, steam vessels and other

vessels.

(III.) To create Banks and other Companies, and authorize persons and Companies, and establish undertakings or associations for purposes consistent with the provisions of this Our Charter.

(iv.) To make and maintain therein roads, harbours, railways, telegraphs, and other public and other works, and carry on therein mining and other industries.

(v.) To make therein concessions of mining,

forestal, or other rights.

(vi.) To improve, develop, clear, plant, and cultivate any territories and lands comprised in the several grants aforesaid or otherwise acquired under this Our Charter.

(vii). To settle any such territories and lands as aforesaid, and to aid and promote immi-

gration into the same.

(VIII.) To grant any lands therein for terms or in perpetuity absolutely, or by way of mortgage or otherwise.

(IX.) To make loans or contributions of money or money's worth, for promoting any of the

objects of the Company

(x.) To acquire and hold personal property. (xi.) To carry on any lawful commerce, trade, or dealing whatsoever, in connection with the objects of the Company.

(XII.) To establish and maintain agencies in

Our colonies and possessions, and elsewhere. (XIII). To sue and be sued by the Company's name of incorporation, as well in Our Courts in Our United Kingdom, or in our Courts in our Colonies, or possessions, or in Our Courts in foreign countries, or elsewhere.

(xiv.) To take and hold without license in mortmain or other authority than this Our Charter messuages and hereditaments in England, and subject to any local law in any

of Our Colonies or Possessions, and elsewhere, convenient for carrying on the management of the affairs of the Company, and to dispose from time to time of any such messuage and hereditaments when not required for that purpose.

(xv.) To do all lawful things incidental or conducive to the exercise or enjoyment of the authorities and powers of the Company in this Our Charter expressed or referred to,

or any of them.

24. Within one year after the date of this Our Charter there shall be executed by the Members of the Company for the time being a deed of settlement, providing so far as necessary for—
(1.) The further definition of the objects and

purposes of the Company.

(II.) The amount and division of the Capital of the Company, and the Calls to be made in respect thereof.

(III.) The division and distribution of profits.

(iv.) The number, qualification, appointment, removal, rotation, and powers of Directors of the Company, and the time when the first appointment of Directors under such deed is to take effect.

(v.) The registration of Members of the Com-

pany.

(vi.) The preparation of annual Accounts, to be submitted to the Members at a General Meeting.

(VII.) The audit of those Accounts by inde-

pendent Auditors.

(vin.) The making of Bye-Laws.

(IX.) The making and using of Official Seals of the Company.

(x.) The winding up (in case of need) of the Company's affairs.

(x1.) Any other matters usual or proper to be provided for in respect of a Chartered Company.

25. The Deed of Settlement shall, before the execution thereof, be submitted to and approved by the Lords of Our Council, and a Certificate of their approval thereof, and signed by the Clerk of Our Council, shall be endorsed on this Our Charter, and on the Deed of Settlement, and such Deed of Settlement shall take effect from the date of such approval.

27. The provisions of the Deed of Settlement may be from time to time varied or added to by a supplementary Deed, made and executed in such manner and subject to such conditions as

the Deed of Settlement prescribes.

27. Such Deed of Settlement may provide for the creation of Founders' Shares, and for assigning to the holders of such Shares a right to a proportion of the profits or revenues of the Gompany, to be defined by the Company's Deed of Settlement, to be approved, as aforesaid, without

contribution to the capital of the Company.

28. The Members of the Company shall be individually liable for the debts, contracts, engagements, and liabilities of the Company to the extent only of the amount for the time being unpaid on the Shares held by them respectively.

29. Until such Deed of Settlement as aforesaid takes effect the said William Mackinnon shall be the President; the said The Right Honourable Lord Brassey, K.C.B., shall be Vice-President; and the said General Sir Donald M. Stewart, Bart., G.C.B.; Sir Thomas Fowell Buxton, Bart. Sir John Kirk, G.C.M.G.; General Sir Arnold Burrowes Kemball, R.A., K.C.S.I.; Lieutenant-General Sir Lewis Pelly, M.P., K.C.B., K.C.S.I.; Colonel Sir Francis de Winton, R.A., K.C.M.G., C.B.; W. Burdett-Coutts, M.P.; Alexander Low Bruce; Robert Palmer Harding; George Suther-land Mackenzie; and Robert Ryrie, shall be Directors of the Company, and may, on behalf of the Company, do all things necessary or proper to be done under this Our Charter by or on

behalf of the Company.

And We do further will, ordain, and declare that this Our Charter shall be acknowledged by Our Governors, and Our Naval and Military Officers, and Our Consuls, and Our other Officers in our Colonies, and possessions, and on the high seas, and elsewhere, and they shall severally give full force and effect to this Our Charter, and shall recognize and be in all things aiding to the

Company and its Officers.

And We do further will, ordain, and declare that this Our Charter shall be taken, construed and adjudged in the most favourable and beneficial sense for and to the best advantage of the Company as well in our Courts in Our United Kingdom, and in Our Courts in Our Colonies or possessions, and in Our Courts in foreign countries or elsewhere, notwithstanding that there may appear to be in this Our Charter any non-recital, mis-recital, uncertainty, or imperfection.

And We do further will, ordain, and declare that this Our Charter shall subsist and continue valid, notwithstanding any lawful change in the name of the Company or in the Deed of Settlement thereof, such change being made with the previous approval of Our Secretary of State

signified under his hand.

And We do lastly will, ordain, and declare, that in case at any time it is made to appear to Us in Our Council that the Company have substantially failed to observe and conform to the provisions of this Our Charter, or that the Company are not exercising their powers under the recited grants, concessions, agreements, and treaties, so as to advance the interests which the Petitioners have represented to Us to be likely to be advanced by the grant of this Our Charter, it shall be lawful for Us, Our heirs, and successors, and We do hereby expressly reserve and take to Ourselves, Our heirs, and successors the right and power by writing under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom to revoke this Our Charter without prejudice to any power to repeal the same by law belonging to Us or them, or to any of Our Courts, Ministers, or Officers, independently of this present declaration and reservation.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK REGU-LATIONS, 1888.

WHEREAS by the Post Office Savings Bank Act, 1861, the Postmaster-General is empowered, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to make, and from time to time to alter, Regulations for superintending, inspecting, and regulating the mode of keeping and examining the accounts of depositors, and with respect to the making of deposits, and to the withdrawal of deposits and interest and all other matters incidental to the carrying the said Act into execution in his department :-

And whereas by the Savings Banks Act, 1887, it is enacted that such Regulations may provide

as in the last-mentioned Act stated.

Now I, Henry Cecil Raikes, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, under and by virtue of all powers and authorities vested in me in that behalf do, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, make the following Regulations, that is to say :-

PRELIMINARY. Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Savings Bank Regulations, 1888.

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires :

The expression "Postmaster-General" means the Postmaster-General for the time being

The expression "National Debt Commissioners" means the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt.

The expression "Savings Bank Business" means the receipt of deposits for remittance to the principal office of the Post Office Savings Bank, and the repayment of such deposits and all business incidental to such receipt and repayment (including business relating to investments in

Government Stock).

The expression "Savings Bank Office" means a Post Office at which Savings Bank business is

The expression "Savings Bank Year" means the twelve months ending on the 31st day of December in any year.

The expression "Investment in Government Stock," and other expressions referring to such investment, relate to investment in Government Stock through the medium of the Post Office Savings Bank, under the provisions of the Savings Banks Act, 1880, and any Acts amending or

extending the same, and the Regulations made in pursuance of such Acts.

The expressions "Savings Bank Annuity" and "Savings Bank Insurance" mean respectively an annuity and an insurance purchased or paid through the medium of the Post Office Savings Bank under the Government Annuities Acts, 1829-1887.

The expression "Friendly Society" means a Friendly Society legally registered in the manner required by the Acts in force relating to Friendly Societies, and includes a Registered Branch.

The expression "Charitable Society" means a Penny Savings Bank, charitable or provident institution or society, and shall include a charitable donation or bequest for the maintenance, educa-

tion, or benefit of the poor.

The expression "Lunacy Trustee" means a person entrusted by the Lord Chancellor with the application of the property of a person of unsound mind, under the provisions of the Lunacy Regulation Acts, 1853 and 1862, and the Lunacy Regulation Amendment Act, 1882.

The expression "Trustee Savings Bank" means a Savings Bank to which the Trustee Savings

Banks Act, 1863, extends.

The term "British Possession" means any part of Her Majesty's Dominions other than the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands, and the Isle of

The expression "Solicitor to the Treasury" means the Solicitor for the Affairs of Her Majesty's Treasury.

The expression "prescribed" means prescribed

for the time being by the Postmaster-General.

The expression "month" means a calendar and not a lunar month.

The masculine gender includes the feminine, and the plural number includes the singular, and the singular number includes the plural.

Operation of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, 1888, on and from which date the Regulations dated the 13th of August, 1861, are hereby repealed, without prejudice, nevertheless, to anything already done in pursuance thereof.

Transaction of Business.

4.—(1.) The following Post Offices shall be Savings Bank Offices :-

(A.) All Post Offices which are Savings Bank Offices at the date of these Regulations.

(B.) All other Post Offices which the Postmaster-General may hereafter appoint to be Savings Bank Offices.

- 2. The Postmaster-General may authorize and direct any of his officers to transact Savings Bank business otherwise than at a Post Office, and for the purpose of these Regulations any officer so authorized shall be included in the term Savings Bank Office.
- (3.) The Postmaster-General may at any time direct that any Savings Bank Office shall cease to be such.
- (4.) Savings Bank business shall be transacted at a Savings Bank Office on such days and during such hours as the Postmaster-General may direct.

BY WHOM DEPOSITS MAY BE MADE

General Description of Depositors.

- 5. Deposits may be made by and in the name
 - (A.) A person of full age and not under legal disability.
 - (B.) A married woman.
 - (c.) An infant of the age of seven years and upwards.

Infants under Seven Years of Age.

6. Deposits may be made on behalf and in the name of an infant under seven years of age by one of the parents of such infant or by any other

Persons of Unsound Mind.

7. Deposits may be made on behalf and in the name of a person of unsound mind by the Committee of his estate or his lunacy trustee.

Joint Accounts.

8. Deposits may be made in the joint names of two or more persons entitled to make a deposit.

Trusi Accounts.

9. Deposits may be made in the name of one person as trustee for another person whose name shall also be entered in the title of the account.

Friendly Societies.

- 10.—(1.) Deposits may be made by a Friendly Society through its trustees, either in the name of such Society or in the name of such trustees, the full name of the Society being entered in the title of the account.
- (2.) Deposits may be made to the credit of any account already opened in the Post Office Savings Bank on behalf of a Friendly Society although such account may not conform to the provisions of this Regulation, but no new account shall be opened except in accordance with such provisions.

Charitable Societies.

11. Deposits may be made by the trustees or treasurer of a Charitable Society.

Corporations.

12. Deposits may be made in the name of a Body Corporate, or Corporation Sole.

Double Deposits.

- 13.-(1.) No depositor in a Trustee Savings Bank shall make any deposit in the Post Office Savings Bank.
- (2.) No depositor in the Post Office Savings Bank shall make any deposit in a Trustee Savings
- (3.) No depositor in the Post Office Savings Bank shall make deposits to the credit of more than one account in such Bank.
- (4.) This Regulation shall not apply to deposits made in the name of any person as trustee for another person also named in the title of the

Interest in more than one Account.

14.—(1.) No person shall be entitled to any benefit from deposits in more than one Savings Bank or standing to the credit of more than one account in a Savings Bank, except so far as such benefit is derived as a member of a Friendly Society or Charitable Society, or as executor, administrator, or other personal representative of a deceased depositor.

(2.) In this Regulation the term "Savings Bank" means the Post Office Savings Bank and

any Trustee Savings Bank.

Penalty.

15. Any person offending against either of the last two preceding Regulations shall, if in the opinion of the Solicitor to the Treasury such offence has been committed with a fraudulent intention, forfeit and lose all right and title to any deposits in or any funds of the Post Office Savings Bank.

> Amount and Limits of Deposits. Amount of Deposits.

16.—(1.) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations deposits of one shilling or any number of shillings, or of pounds and shillings, may be made by a depositor.

No. 25854.

(2.) For the purpose of immediate investment Government Stock, or the purchase of a Savings Bank Annuity, or Savings Bank Insurance, but for no other purpose, deposits of pounds, shillings, and pence may be made by a depositor.

Limits of Deposits.

17.-(1.) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations no depositor shall deposit :-

(a.) Any greater sum than £30 in the course

of one Savings Bank year.

(b.) Any sum which shall make the total amount deposited by such depositor exceed £150.

(2.) This Regulation shall not apply to deposits made by a Friendly Society, or by the trustees or treasurer of a Charitable Society, or to deposits directed to be made by or under the authority of any Statute, where such Statute authorizes the making of deposits without limit.

Limits of Deposits for Charitable Societies.

18. Except with the approval of the National Debt Commissioners, the trustees or treasurer of a Charitable Society shall not deposit :-

(a.) Any greater sum than £100 in the course of any Savings Bank year.

(b.) Any sum which shall make the total amount deposited by such trustees or treasurer exceed £300.

Use of Savings Bank Account for Purchase of Government Stock, Annuities, and Insurances.

- 19. The following sums may be deposited by a depositor in addition to the sums hereinbefore mentioned :-
 - (A.) Any sum which replaces deposits made and invested (other than deposits made for the purpose of immediate investment) during the current Savings Bank year in Government Stock.

Provided that the total sum deposited in any one Savings Bank year shall not exceed by more than £30 the amount invested in Government Stock in that year.

(B.) Any sum deposited for the purpose of immediate investment in Government Stock.

(c.) Any sum deposited for the purpose of the purchase of a Savings Bank Annuity or a Savings Bank Insurance

PROCEDURE ON MAKING DEPOSITS.

Declaration.

20.—(1.) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, a depositor on making a first deposit, and whenever thereafter he is required so to do. shall specify his Christian name and surname, occupation, and residence to the Postmaster-General, and shall make and sign a declaration in the prescribed form.

(2.) Such declaration shall contain a statement to the effect that the person by or on whose behalf the deposit is made is not entitled to any benefit from any deposits in the Post Office Savings Bank or any Trustee Savings Bank except deposits belonging to a Friendly Society or Charitable Society of which such person may be a member, and except deposits derived solely as executor, administrator, or other personal representative of a deceased depositor in any Savings Bank.

Declaration to be made by Depositors.

(3.) Such declaration shall be witnessed by

one of the following persons (that is to say):—
(A.) The Officer of the Postmaster-General receiving the deposit.

(B.) Some person known to him.
(C.) Some other Officer of the Postmaster-General.

(D.) A Minister of any Religious Denomination.

(E.) A Justice of the Peace.

(F.) A Commissioner to Administer Oaths in the Supreme Court of Judicature.

(G.) Any other person approved by the Post-

master-General in that behalf.

(4.) If such declaration, or any part thereof. shall not be true, and if in the opinion of the Solicitor to the Treasury any mis-statement has been made with a fraudulent intention, the depositor making the same shall forfeit and lose all right and title to any deposit in or any funds of the Post Office Savings Bank.

(5.) This Regulation shall not apply to deposits made by or under the authority of any statutes where such statute dispenses with the making of

the precribed declaration.

Declaration as to Accounts of Infants under Seven. 21.—(1.) When a first deposit is made on behalf and in the name of an infant under seven years of age, such declaration as aforesaid shall be made by the person making the deposit, and such person shall specify at the foot of such declaration the day on which the said infant will attain the age of seven years.

(2.) When deposits are made on behalf and in the name of an infant under seven years of age, so soon as such infant attains the age of seven years, he shall, when required by the Postmaster-General, make such declaration as aforesaid.

Declaration as to Accounts of Persons of Unsound Mind.

. 22. When a first deposit is made on behalf of a person of unsound mind, such declaration as aforesaid shall be made by the Committee of his estate or his Lunacy Trustee (as the case may be), and in every such case the person making the deposit shall specify the capacity in which he acts.

Declaration as to Trust Accounts.

23. Where a first deposit is made in the name of one person as trustee for another person whose name is also entered on the title of the account, such declaration as aforesaid shall be made by the trustee.

Declaration as to Accounts of Charitable Societies and Corporate Bodies.

24. When a first deposit is made by the trustees or treasurer of any Charitable Society, or in the name of any Body Corporate, the prescribed declaration shall be made by the Officer of the Society or Body Corporate making the deposit, and in every such case such Officer shall specify the capacity in which he acts.

Declaration as to Accounts of Corporations Sole. 25. When a first deposit is made in the name of any Corporation Sole, the prescribed declaration shall be made by the person representing such Corporation for the time being.

Depositor's Book.

26.-(1.) When a first deposit is made, a numbered book (hereinafter referred to as the depositor's book) shall be handed to the depositor.

- (2.) The depositor, or where the deposit is made in the name of a Friendly Society or Body Corporate, the Officer of the Society or Body Corporate making the deposit, shall sign his name in the place provided for his signature in the depositor's book.
- (3.) The amount of every deposit shall be entered by the Officer receiving the same in the depositor's book, and such Officer shall affix his initials and the dated stamp of his office opposite each entry, and shall immediately report the receipt of the said deposit to the Postmaster-General.

(4.) No charge shall be made for a depositor's book except where expressly provided by these Regulations.

(5.) Every depositor's book shall be deemed to be the property of the Postmaster-General, and shall be delivered up as and when required by the

Postmaster-General.

Acknowledgment of Deposits.

27.—(1.) The Postmaster-General shall forthwith upon receiving information of any deposit from the Officer receiving the same, transmit to the depositor an acknowledgment of the receipt of the said sum.

(2.) Such acknowledgment shall be signified by the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank, or by such other Officer as the Postmaster-General shall appoint for the purpose, and shall be in the

prescribed form.

(3.) A depositor who does not within ten days from the day on which he has made a deposit receive an acknowledgment of such deposit from the Postmaster-General, shall, by a letter addressed to the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank, demand such acknowledgment of the Postmaster-

(4.) If the sum mentioned in any acknowledgment is not identical with the sum actually deposited by a depositor, or the sum entered in such depositor's book, he shall at once, by letter addressed to the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank, call the attention of the Postmaster-General to the discrepancy.

WITHDRAWALS.

Procedure on Withdrawals.

28.—(1.) Any depositor wishing to withdraw the whole or part of the sum deposited by him, shall nake application to the Postmaster-General in the prescribed form.

(2.) A printed copy of such form may be

obtained at any Savings Bank Office.

(3.) In such form the depositor shall specify the number of his book, the name of the office, or other distinctive letters or marks printed on the cover of such book, the sum he wishes to withdraw, his occupation and residence, and the Post Office at which he wishes to receive his money.

(4.) On receipt of this application a Warrant for the amount required, payable at the Office named therein, shall be sent to the applicant by

post.

(5.) Such Warrant shall be in the prescribed form.

(6.) The Warrant shall be presented at the Post Office named therein together with the de-

positor's book.

(7.) The Paying Officer shall enter the amount repaid in the depositor's book, and attest the entry with his initials and the dated stamp of his

(8.) The Paying Officer shall take a receipt on the Warrant for the sum therein specified from the person therein named or any person authorized by him (as provided by these Regulations) to receive the said sum, and such receipt shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum specified in the Warrant.

Withdrawals from Accounts of Infants.

29.—(1.) An application for the withdrawal of money deposited by or in the name of an infant may be made by such infant if of the age of seven years or upwards.

(2.) The Warrant issued on such application

shall be made out in the name of such infant, and his receipt shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum specified in such Warrant.

(3.) Where it is proved to the satisfaction of the Postmaster - General that any sums in the name of an infant under the age of seven years are urgently needed for the maintenance, education, or benefit of such infant, or that from any other circumstances it is expedient to pay such sums, or any part thereof, the Postmaster-General may pay such deposits, or any part thereof, to any person who may satisfy the Postmaster-General that he will apply such money for the benefit of such infant, and the receipt of such person shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for sums so paid.

Withdrawals from Accounts of Lunatics.

30.—(1.) An application for the withdrawal of money deposited in the name of a person of unsound mind shall be made by the Committee of the Estate of such person or his Lunacy Trustee.

(2.) The Warrant issued on such application shall be made out in the name of such Committee or Lunacy Trustee, and his receipt shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the

sum specified in such Warrant.

(3.) Where a depositor is insane and no Committee of his Estate or Lunacy Trustee has been appointed, the Postmaster-General may, when it is proved to his satisfaction that it is just and expedient so to do, pay the deposits standing in the name of the depositor, or any part thereof, to any person whom he shall judge proper to receive the same, and the receipt of such person shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum so paid.

Withdrawals from Joint Accounts.

.31.—(1.) An application to withdraw money deposited in the joint names of two or more persons shall be made by all such persons, or by the survivor among such persons.
(2.) The Postmaster-General may require

proof of survivorship to his satisfaction.

(3.) The Warrant issued on such application shall be made out in the names of the applicants, and their receipt shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum stated in the Warrant.

Withdrawals from Trust Accounts.

32.—(1.) An application to withdraw money deposited in the name of one person as Trustee for another person shall be made jointly by all the persons named in the title of the account, or by the survivor, among such persons.

(2.) The Postmaster-General may require proof

of survivorship to his satisfaction.

(3.) The Warrant issued on such application shall be made out in the names of the applicants, and their receipt shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum stated in the

Insanity of Depositor in Trust Account.

33. Where a depositor named in a trust account has become insane or bankrupt, the Postmaster-General may, in his discretion, pay the deposits to the other person named in such account, with or without the concurrence of the Committee of the Estate, Lunacy Trustee, or Trustee in Bank. ruptcy (if any) of the depositor who has become insane or bankrupt, and the receipt of such person shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum so paid.

Withdrawals from Accounts in name of Friendly Societies.

-(I.) An application to withdraw money deposited in the name of a Friendly Society, or of the Trustees or any officer of a Friendly Society, shall be made by a Trustee of such Society, or the I Warrant.

Treasurer, Steward, or Secretary, or any other officer of such Society.

(2.) The Postmaster-General may require proof to his satisfaction that the applicant occupies the

position he claims to occupy.

(3.) The Warrant issued on such application shall be made out in the name of the Society, or of its registered Trustees for the time being, or of its Treasurer for the time being if authorized by the Rules of the Society to receive the moneys of the Society, and the receipt of such Trustees or Treasurer (as the case may be) shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum stated in the Warrant.

Withdrawals from Accounts in Name of Officers of Friendly Societies, and from Accounts of Charitable Societies.

35.—. 1.) An application to withdraw money deposited in the name of the trustees or treasurer of any Charitable Society shall be made by the persons filling the office of treasurer, steward, or trustees for the time being.

(2.) The Postmaster - General may require proof to his satisfaction that the applicants occupy

the position they claim to occupy.

(3.) The Warrant issued on such application shall be made out in the names of the applicants, and their receipt shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum stated in the Warrant.

Withdrawals from Accounts of Corporate Bodies. 36 .- (1.) An application to withdraw any money deposited in the name of a Body Corporate shall be made under the Seal of such Body Corporate, or by the secretary or two of the directors of such Body for the time being.

(2.) The Postmaster-General may require proof to his satisfaction that any person signing an application fills the office he claims to hold.

(3.) The Warrant issued on such application shall be made out in the name of the Body Corporate, or of the persons signing the applica-tion (as the case may be), and a receipt under the Corporate Seal, or the receipt of the applicants (as the case may be) shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sums stated in the Warrant.

Withdrawals from Accounts of Corporations Sole. 37.—(1.) An application to withdraw any money deposited in the name of a Corporation

Sole shall be made by the person representing such Corporation Sole for the time being.

(2.) The Postmaster-General may require to his satisfaction proof that the applicant represents

the Corporation.

(3.) The Warrant issued on such application shall be made out in the name of the applicant, and his receipt shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum stated in the

Request for Payment to one of several Persons.

38. When an application for the withdrawal of money is made by more persons than one, the applicants may request that the sum to be withdrawn may be paid to any one or more of them to the exclusion of the others, and in such case the Warrant shall be made out in the name of the person specified in such request, and his receipt shall be deemed to be the receipt of all the applicants.

Authority for Payment to Third Party.
39.—(1.) A Warrant shall be presented by the person named therein, or by a person duly authorized by him to receive the sum specified in the

(2.) An authority to receive the amount payable on a Warrant must be given either by Power of Attorney under seal duly executed in the presence of a witness, or by a letter or order signed in the presence of one of the following persons, that is to say:—

(A.) Any Officer of the Postmaster-General other than the Paying Officer.

(B.) A Minister of any Religious denomination.

(c.) A Justice of the Peace.

(D.) A Commissioner to Administer Oaths in the Supreme Court of Judicature.

(E.) In case of sickness the Medical Attendant of the person named in the Warrant.

(F.) Where the person named in the Warrant is abroad the British Consular Authority, or a Notary Public, or some constituted authority of the place in which such person resides.

(6.) Where the person named in the Warrant is in the Army or Navy any commissioned Officer of his Regiment or Ship.

(H.) Where the person named in the Warrant is at sea, the Captain of his vessel.

(3.) Any such letter or order as last aforesaid should be in the prescribed form which may be obtained at any Savings Bank Office.

Responsibility of Postmaster-General.

40. The Postmaster-General shall in no case be responsible for the misapplication by any Friendly Society, Charitable Society, Body Corporate or Corporation Sole, or any trustees, directors, officer, or representative of any such Society, Body, or Corporation of any sum paid to such Society, Body Corporate, Corporation Sole, trustees, directors, officer, or representative.

TRANSFER OF DEPOSITS.

Transfer from one Account to another.

41.—(1.) Any depositor may apply to the Postmaster-General for the transfer of deposits standing in his name into the name of any other per on entitled to deposit in the Post Office Savings Bank.

(2.) Such application shall be in the prescribed form, copies of which may be obtained from the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank.

(3.) Every such application shall be accompanied by the depositor's Bo k, or by such other evidence as the Postmaster-General may require of the title of the depositor to the sums to which the application relates.

(4.) Every such application shall also be accompanied by a statement of the full name and address of the person to whose name it is desired to transfer the deposits (i.eveinafter referred to as the transferee), and particulars of the account (if any) to which the deposits are to be transferred.

(5.) Upon receiving such application as aforesaid, and being satisfied as to the title of the applicant to transfer the deposits to which the application relates, the Postmaster-General shall transfer from the account of the applicant to the account of the transferee the sum specified in the application.

(6.) Such application shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General from the transferor for

the sum specified therein.

(7.) If the transferee is not already a depositor-

(a.) He shall be required to make a like declaration to that made in relation to a first deposit.

(b.) A depositor's Book shall be handed to him, and he shall sign his name in the place provided for his signature in such Book.

(c.) Where the transfer is made into the name of a Friendly Society or Body Corporate,

any such declaration and signature as last aforesaid shall (so far as the same are necessary in the case of a first deposit), be made and given by the person who would make and give the same in the case of a first deposit.

Transfer from Account of Deceased Depositor.

- 42.—(1.) Any person of the age of 16 years or upwards to whom any sum due to a depositor at the time of his decease might be paid under and in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations, may, subject to the provisions of these Regulations as to duty in lieu of withdrawing such sum, apply to the Postmaster-General for the transfer of such sum into his own name, or the name of any other person specified in such application.
- (2.) The provisions of these Regulations relating to the transfer of deposits shall apply to the transfer of sums from the account of a deceased depositor, so far as the same are applicable.

Limits in case of Transfer.

43.—(1.) For the purpose of calculating the limits of deposits in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations, every sum transferred to the account of any depositor (other than a sum transferred from the account of a deceased depositor), shall be deemed to be a deposit by the depositor to whom such sum is transferred.

(2.) When by reason of the transfer of any sum from the account of a deceased depositor, the sum standing to the credit of the trustees or treasurer of a Charitable Society exceeds £300, exclusive of interest, or the sum standing to the credit of any other depositor exceeds £200 in the whole, the depositor shall be required to withdraw any sum in excess of the respective limits aforesaid.

(3.) This Regulation shall not apply to Friendly Societies or to Charitable Societies when the approval of the National Debt Commissioners has been obtained to the making of deposits without restriction as to amount.

Alteration in Title of Trust Account.

44.—(1.) Where deposits have been made in the name of one person as trustee for another person whose name is also entered in the title of the account, upon the application of such lastnamed person the Postmaster-General may, in case he should think it just and expedient so to do, remove the name of the trustee from the title of the account, and may substitute the name of another trustee in the place thereof, or may enter the account in the name of the person on whose behalf the deposits were made.

(2.) Where the name of a new trustee is substituted, such trustee shall make the declaration required upon the making of a first deposit.

(3.) In any case provided for by this Regulation the receipt of the persons named in the title of the account as altered in manner provided by this Regulation shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for any sums standing to the credit of the account.

Transfer from Post Office Savings Bank to Trustee Savings Bank.

45. An application to transfer deposits from the Post Office Savings Bank to a Trustee Savings Bank shall be made in the prescribed form, which may be obtained at any Savings Bank Office, and shall be accompanied by the depositor's book, or by other evidence; to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General, of the title of the applicant to the deposits to which the application relates.

Transfer from Trus'ee Savings Bank to Post Office Savings Bank.

46.—(1.) Upon production of a certificate from a Trustee Savings Bank, certifying the sum due to a depositor in respect of money deposited by him in the said Bank, and that such depositor has closed his account with such bank, the amount mentioned in the said certificate shall be treated as a first deposit made in the name of the applicant, and the applicant shall make the prescribed declaration and observe such other rules as are applicable to the making of a first deposit.

NOMINATIONS.

A Depositor may Nominate.

47. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations a depositor of the age of 16 years or upwards may nominate any person to receive any sum due to such depositor at his decease.

Requirements of a Nomination.

48.—(1.) Every such nomination shall be in writing and shall be signed by the depositor in the presence of a witness, and shall be sent by post or otherwise to the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank during the lifetime of the depositor.

(2.) Every such nomination shall be in the prescribed form (which may be obtained from the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank), or in some other form to be approved by the Postmaster-General.

Registration.

49. Every such nomination shall be registered by the Postmaster-General.

Revocation.

50 .- (1.) Any such nomination may be revoked by the depositor by writing under his hand signed in the presence of a witness.

(2.) Any such revocation shall be sent by post or otherwise to the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank during the lifetime of the depositor, and shall be registered by the Postmaster-General in like manner as in the case of a nomination.

Scope of Nomination.

51.-(1.) A nomination may relate to the whole of the deposits standing in the name of a depositor, or to part only of such deposits.

(2.) Except where otherwise stated, a nomination shall be deemed to extend to all sums to which a depositor is entitled at the time of his decease in respect of Government Stock or a Savings Bank Annuity, but a depositor may in a nomination expressly exclude any of such sums from the operation of such nomination.

Division of Sums Nominated.

52. A nomination may be in favour of one person or of several persons, and in the latter case may direct that specific sums shall be paid to one or more of the persons named in the nomination, or that the persons named in such nomination may take the deposits in specified shares, or may give directions to both effects.

Witness to Nomination Disqualified from taking under it.

53. No person who witnesses the signature of a depositor to a nomination shall take any benefit under such nomination.

Operation of Nomination.

54.—(1.) Where the sums due on the decease of a depositor do not exceed in the whole the sum of £100, the Postmaster-General shall pay the persons named in any nomination made by such depositor and in force at the time of his death according to the directions of such nomination.

- (2.) If upon the decease of a depositor the sums due to him or to his estate exceed £100 any nomination made by such depositor shall take effect as regards any sum or sums to which the same relates not exceeding £100 in like manner as if it were a will of the deceased depositor duly executed, but shall not take effect in any other manner, and a nomination shall not in such case be deemed void because the depositor was a minor at the time such nomination was made.
- (3.) In any such case as last aforesaid, the Postmaster-General may, subject to the provisions of this Regulation, pay any sum or sums to which a nomination relates, not exceeding in the aggregate £100, according to the directions of such nomination, notwithstanding the production of probate of the will of a deceased depositor, orletters of administration to his estate.

Nominations to be Entered on Transfer Certificates.

55. On any certificate granted to a depositor by the Postmaster-General for the purpose of transferring deposits from the Post Office Savings Bank to a Trustee Savings Bank, a memorandum shall be made specifying the date and other particulars of any nomination made in respect of such deposits.

Effect of Transfer on Nomination of Deposits in Trustee Savings Bank.

- 56.-(1.) When deposits are transferred from a Trustee Savings Bank to the Post Office Savings Bank, any nomination made with respect to such deposits while in the Trustee Savings Bank, shall (if such nomination is brought to the notice of the Postmaster-General) be deemed to hold good with respect to deposits in the Post Office Savings Bank.
- (2.) The Postmaster-General may require proof to his satisfaction of the making of any such nomination, and that the same is at the date of the transfer of full force and effect.

PAYMENT OF DEPOSITS OF DECEASED DEPOSITORS. Proof of Death.

57. The Postmaster-General may require proof to his satisfaction of the decease of a depositor.

Deposits under £100.

- 58.—(1.) Where the whole amount due to a depositor at the time of his decease does not exceed £100 exclusive of interest and probate of the will of such depositor, or letters of administration to his estate and effects is not or are not produced within such time as the Postmaster-General thinks reasonable, if such depositor has made no nomination, and so far as any nomination does not extend, the Postmaster-General may, without requiring probate of the will or letters of administration to the estate and effects of the deceased depositor, in his discretion pay or distribute the amount so due as aforesaid, to or among any of the persons hereinafter described or indicated, that is to say :-
 - (1.) Any person who has paid the funeral expenses of the depositor.

- (2.) Creditors of the depositor,(3.) The widow or widower of the depositor,
- (4.) The persons entitled to the effects of the depositor according to the Statute of Distribution,
- (5.) The person entitled to take out probate or letters of administration to the depositor,
- (6.) In the case of foreign seamen, the consular authority of any country with whom a treaty has been made relative to the payment of moneys due to such seamen,
- (7.) In the case of the decease of an in-pen.

sioner of Chelsea Hospital, the Quarter-master of such hospital,

(8.) Any person undertaking to maintain the

children of the depositor.

(2.) In making such payment and distribution as aforesaid the Postmaster-General shall have regard to the rules of law regulating the distribution of the Estates of Intestates; but he may, nevertheless, when he considers that injustice or hardship would result from adherence to such rules make such payment and distribution otherwise than in accordance with such rules.

(3.) The receipt of any of the persons mentioned in this Regulation shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum paid, and any such receipt may be signed by any widow, widower, or next-of-kin above the age of 16 years, notwithstanding that she or he has not attained the age of 21 years.

711 1.1 . TO

Illegitimate Depositors. 59. Where any depositor being illegitimate dies intestate, leaving no widow, widower, or issue, if such depositor has made no nomination, and so far as any nomination does not extend, the Postmaster-General may pay the sums due to such deceased depositor to any person satisfying the Postmaster-General that he is a creditor of the deceased depositor, or to any other person appearing to the Postmaster-General to be justly entitled to receive such sums. Provided that where the whole amount due to the depositor exceeds £100, exclusive of interest, no payment shall be made under this Regulation, unless in any particular case the special circumstances shall, in the opinion of the Solicitor to the Treasury, justify such payment.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Interest.

69.—(1.) Interest, calculated yearly at the rate of two pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, shall be allowed on every complete pound deposited.

(2.) Such interest shall be computed from the first day of the calendar month next following the day on which a complete pound shall have been deposited, or on which deposits of a less amount shall have made up a complete pound, and shall cease on the first day of the calendar month in which moneys are withdrawn.

(3.) Interest after the rate and subject to the conditions aforesaid will be calculated to the 31st December in every year, and will then be added to and become part of the principal money.

(4.) When by the addition of any deposit or of any interest or dividend on Government Stock the total sum standing in the name of any depositor amounts to or exceeds the sum of £200, no further interest shall be payable on such deposits so long as they continue to amount to the said sum of £200.

Annual Transmission of Depositor's Book to Principal Office of Savings Bank.

61. Every depositor shall once in each year, on the anniversary of the day on which he made his first deposit, and at any other time when required by the Postmaster-General, forward his book to the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank, in a cover to be obtained at any Savings Bank. Office, in order that the entries in the said book may be compared with the entries in the books of the Postmaster-General, and that the interest due to the depositor may be inserted in his book.

Loss of Depositor's Book.

62.—(1.) If any depositor shall lose his book and shall desire a new book, application must be

made by him to the Postmaster-General by letter stating the circumstances, and enclosing stamps or a postal order of the value of one shilling.

(2.) Upon receiving such application the Post-master-General may, if he thinks fit, issue a new book to the applicant.

Marksmen.

63.—(1.) Where a first deposit is made by a person who cannot write, his mark must be affixed to the prescribed declaration in the presence of a witness, who must certify that such declaration has before being made by the depositor been first audibly, clearly, and distinctly read over to him in the presence and hearing of the witness, when the depositor appeared perfectly to understand the same, and made his mark thereto, in the presence of the witness.

(2.) Where the depositor cannot write, any authority to receive the amount payable on a Warrant must be executed or signed by the depositor in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation as to the making of the prescribed declaration by a person who cannot write, so far

as such provisions are applicable.

(3.) Where the person to whom a Warrant is made payable cannot write, he must, when he presents the Warrant for payment, affix his mark to the receipt at the foot of the Warrant in the presence of some person who is known to the paying officer, and who can identify the person applying for the money as the person named in the Warrant.

Rectification of Mistakes.

64. Where a first or any other deposit is made in error, the Postmaster-General may return the same, and cancel all proceedings taken in respect thereof, or may take such other steps as may be necessary to give effect to the intention of the parties.

Protection to the Postmaster-General when acting in accordance with Regulations.

65. When any payment is made, or act done by the Postmaster-General, in accordance with the Savings Bank Acts and the Regulations for the time being made thereunder, he shall be indemnified against all claims on the part of any person in respect of such payment or act, but any person may, nevertheless, recover any sum lawfully due to him from the person to whom the Postmaster-General has paid the same.

Succession and Legacy Duties.

66.—(1.) If the total personal property of any deceased depositor exceeds £100 sterling, any sum which may under these Regulations be paid otherwise than to the legal personal representative of the depositor shall, notwithstanding such payment, be liable to probate duty as part of the amount on which such duty is charged, and the Postmaster-General may, before making such payment, require a statutory declaration by the claimant, or by one of the claimants, that the total personal estate of the deceased, including the sum in question does not, after deduction of debts and funeral expenses exceed the value of £100.

(2.) In every case where the whole amount due to a depositor at the time of his decease exceeds £80, the Postmaster-General shall, before making any payment to any person other than the legal personal representative of the deceased depositor, require production of a duly stamped receipt for the succession or legacy duty payable in respect of such deposits, or a certificate from the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, stating that no such duty is payable.

Exemption from Stamp Duty. 67.—(1.) No warrant or other order for the

payment of money, no receipt or other acknowledgment for the receipt of money, and no Power of Attorney or other document in relation to the payment or receipt of money deposited in the Post Office Savings Bank shall be liable to or charged with any Stamp Duty.

(2.) A nomination made under these Regulations shall not be liable to or charged with Stamp

Duty (other than Probate duty).

Exemption from Postage.

68. Declarations, depositors' Books, Acknowledgments, notices of withdrawal, warrants, and all Documents and Correspondence passing between the Postmaster-General and any depositor or other person in relation to Savings Bank Business shall be transmitted by post free of postage.

APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

England and Ireland.

69. These Regulations shall apply to England and Ireland.

Scotland.

70. These Regulations shall apply to Scotland with the following modifications (that is to say):—

(1.) Expressions referring to the personal property or personal estate of a deceased depositor shall, in the case of a depositor domiciled in Scotland, be deemed to refer to the movable or personal estate of such depositor.

- (2.) Expressions referring to the persons entitled to the effects of a deceased depositor according to the Statute of Distributions, shall, in the case of a depositor domiciled in Scotland, be deemed to refer to the persons entitled to share in the distribution of the movable or personal estate of such depositor according to the law of Scotland.
- (3.) Expressions referring to the committee of the estate, or the lunacy trustee of an insane depositor, shall be deemed to refer to the curator or curator bonis of a depositor found insane according to the law of Scotland.
