By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this

Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

An Area comprising a certain farm and premises known as the Post Office at Glewstone in the parish of Marstow, in the county of Hereford, and the highway leading from Glewstone Cross in the parish of Marstow to Wilson Cross in the parish of Peterstow.

CHINA.—EAST COAST.—CHUSAN ARCHIPELAGO.

THE following information concerning certain sunken rocks and bank in Chusan Archipelago, the result of recent examination of the localities, has been received from Commander W. U. Moore, H.M. Surveying-Vessel "Rambler":—

(1.) *Sunken Rock North-west of Steep Island.*

A sharp pinnacle rock (named Andersen Rock, from having been discovered by Captain Andersen, H.I.C.M.S. "Ping Ching") with a depth of four feet, but on which the sea has never been seen to break, lies with Steep Island Lighthouse bearing S. 34° E., distant 4½ cables.
