(SWINE-FEVER.)

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 16th day of October, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this

Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising a certain farm and premises known as the Post Office at Glewstone in the parish of Marstow, in the county of Hereford, and the highway leading from Glewstone Cross in the parish of Marstow to Wilson Cross in the parish of Peterstow.

THE Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education have issued this day an Order for the Triennial Election of the School Board for London, on Monday, 26th of November, 1888, which amongst other regulations contains the following:—

1. The Returning Officer for the election of the School Board for London shall be Sir Thomas Chambers, Q.C., Recorder of the City of London, or his Deputy.

2. The School Board for London shall consist of fifty-five members, and the number of such members to be elected and the Deputy Returning Officer in each Division shall be the numbers and the persons respectively mentioned in the second and third columns of the Schedule annexed.
