THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the parish of St. Leonard, in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, The Haven from Sheep Wash Bridge on the Hastings and Bexhill-road to the Horse Bridge over the said Haven leading from Wilting Farm to Pehsham, continuing from the Horse Bridge in a straight line to Wilting Railway Bridge, from thence by the Railway from Battle to Hastings to Filsham Bridge over the said Railway, and thence by the road leading from Hollington to Bulverhythe as far as the said Sheep Wash Bridge,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and, declare that John James Thomas Cocks, Esquire, and Frances Allen, the widow and relict of Philip Allen, Esquire, late Colonial Treasurer at Natal, in South Africa, deceased, the brother and sister of the said Philip Reginald, now Lord Sommers, Baron of Evesham, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their father, the said Philip James Cocks, had survived his cousin, the said Charles Somers, third Earl Sommers and fourth Lord Sommers, Baron of Evesham, had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Lord Sommers, Baron of Evesham:

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a Notification, dated 22nd ultimo, from Her Majesty's Representative at Tokio, respecting the medical inspection of arrivals from Hong Kong or Amoy :-

With reference to the Notification issued by me on the 4th of July last, informing British subjects that medical inspection had been instituted by the Japanese Government at the ports of Nagasaki, Kobe, and Yokohama, for all ships coming from Hong Kong or Amoy, then declared infected by cholera, I hereby make it known to British subjects residing in, or resorting to, Japan, that I have received a communication from his Excellency the Japanese Minister for Foreign Affairs, to the effect that the said medical inspection was discontinued from yesterday, the 21st September.
