THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the School Board for the District of West Bromwich and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majestty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:-

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACTS, 1882 and 1885.

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a charter is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the charter, the Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Act named :

"And whereas by the School Boards Act, 1885, the said Act has been amended, and further powers have been conferred with respect to the making of such a Scheme as aforesaid:

"And whereas on the 13th day of September, 1882, Her Majesty was pleased by Royal charter to create the parish of West Bromwich, in the county of Stafford, a municipal borough, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof and to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the said borough :

"And whereas at the date of the said charter there was in existence a School Board for the District of West Bromwich which was coextensive with the said parish (which School Board is hereinafter referred to as the District School Board):

"And whereas the District School Board con-

tinued to act for the said district until the 7th day of March, 1883 :

"And whereas in accordance with a notice, dated January 8th, 1883, sent by the Education Department and addressed to the Mayor of the borough of West Bromwich, a School Board was elected for the borough of West Bromwich, and the same is hereinafter referred to as the School Board of 1883:

"And whereas the School Board of 1883 continued to act for the said parish and borough until the 7th day of March, 1886 :

"And whereas by an Order made by the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education (in this Scheme referred to as the Education Department), on the 11th day of February, 1886, after resolution passed by the Council of the said borough and an application made in conformity with section 12 of the Education Act, 1870, a School Board was caused by the Education Department to be formed for the borough of West Bromwich in accordance with the provisions of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, and the Acts amending the same; and a School Board for the said borough was duly elected (the said School Board being hereinafter referred to as the School Board of the Borough of West Bromwich):

"And whereas under the provisions of the School Boards Act, 1885, Daniel Howard, a member of the District School Board and the School Board of 1883, and of the School Board of the Borough of West Bromwich, petitioned Her Majesty in Council that a Scheme might be made and settled:

"And whereas this Scheme, before being settled by the Committee of Council, was referred to the consideration of the Education Department:

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a Scheme should be settled pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, containing the provisions hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order, direct, and declare as follows :--

(1.) This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the West Bromwich School Board Scheme, 1888.

"(2.) This Scheme shall come into operation at the date of its confirmation by Parliament cr Order in Council. This date is herein mentioned as the 'commencement of this Scheme,' "(3.) Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the District School Board and the School Board of 1883 shall cease to exist.

"(4.) The School Board of the borough of West Bromwich shall be deemed to have been since its formation, and to be, and shall continue to be, for all purposes whatsoever, the School Board for the said borough, and every thing in connection with the said Board and borough shall be had and done accordingly, and not otherwise.

" (5.) All liabilities and assets attaching to and. vested in the District School Board, or the School Board of 1883; or the School Board of the borough of West Bromwich immediately before the commencement of this Scheme, shall be or continue (as the case may be) attached to and vested-in-the-School-Board of the borough of West Bromwich, and all charges charged by the District School Board, or the School Board of 1883, or the School Board of the borough of West Bromwich on the poor rate, and the school fund of the parish of West Bromwich, or on the borough rate and fund and school fund of the said borough (as the case may be) before the commencement of this Scheme shall be, or continue to be (as the case may be) charges upon the borough rate and fund of the said borough and the school fund of the said borough respectively, and not otherwise.

"(6:) Any bye-laws purporting to have been made under the Elementary Education Act, 1870, and the Acts amending the same and in force at the date of this Scheme in the said parish or borough, shall continue in force.

"(7.) Any act or omission done or made by the Education Department, or the said School Boards, or the Council of the said borough, or any Justice since the date of the Charter, shall be deemed to have been lawfully done or made if it might have been lawfully done or made in case no Charter had been granted, or the said School Boards, or any of them, had been the School Board for the said borough."

HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Hencurable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Yarkhill, in the county of Hereford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the Hereford and Gloucester Canal, on the east-the road from Monkhide by Covender and Little Yarkhill to the river Frome, on the south the river Frome and the road from Stoke bridge to the parish boundary of Westhide near to the Castle farm, and on the west the said par sh boundary,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-seventh day of Sei tember, one thousand eight hundred and eighty eighf, to be an Area infected with swinefever, is hereby declared to be free from swinefever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement o' this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and imme-

diately after the eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.


