The intended Act will incorporate, with or without modification, all or some of the provisions of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; the Companies Clauses Act, 1863; the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869; the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847; and the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1871; and it will vary or extinguish any rights or privileges with which it may be expedient to interfere for any of the purposes thereof, and confer other rights and privileges.

Printed copies of the intended Act will, on or before the 21st day of December next, be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
