**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 14th day of November, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Waltham Abbey, in the parish of Waltham Holy Cross, in the Epping Division of the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, starting from the junction of Sewardstone-street with Little Sewardstone-street and proceeding west along the south side of Little Sewardstone-street to the west side of Black Boy-alley, thence south along the west side of Black Boy-alley to the north side of Town Mead-lane, thence east along the north side of Town Mead-lane to the west side of Sewardstone-street, and thence north along the west side of Sewardstone-street to the point of starting,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the seventeenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The following Area (namely),—at Llanidabo, in the county of Hereford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing from the Axe and Cleaver public-house down the lane leading to Bigglestone farmhouse, including the whole of the homestead and buildings, thence by a straight line to New Mills, thence by the brook to a point where the same crosses the road at Hoarwithy, thence by the road leading from Hoarwithy by Redbrook Farm and Harewood Farm to the main road at Harewood End, and thence by the main road to the Axe and Cleaver public-house aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a Notice recently published by the Danish Government:—

Notice to the effect that the provisions of the 2nd Section, I, of the Law concerning measures to prevent the introduction of infectious diseases into the kingdom of the 2nd July, 1880, come into force, until further notice, with respect to ships arriving from Marseilles or from Sicilian ports:—

In consequence of a report that an epidemic of smallpox has broken out at Marseilles, and at various towns in Sicily, the provisions of the 2nd Section, I, of the Law concerning measures to prevent the introduction of infectious diseases into the kingdom, of the 2nd July, 1880, come into force, until further notice, with respect to ships arriving from or having touched at Marseilles or Sicilian ports, in consequence of which it is forbidden, in view of the 32nd paragraph of the aforesaid Law, to import into the kingdom from any of the above-mentioned ports dirty linen and bed clothes, in so far as these articles do not form part of the luggage of travellers, rags, used wadding, carded wool, waste paper, hair, and hides.

There will be no quarantine for the present.

The provisions of the 2nd section, I, of the Law concerning measures to prevent the introduction of infectious diseases into the kingdom, of the 2nd of July, 1880, are accordingly in force with respect to the following places:—

Ports in Sicily,  
Ports on the French Coast between Nantes and St. Malo, both inclusive.  
Egersund,  
All Chilian ports,  
All ports in Florida,  
All ports in Jamaica,  
All ports in Martinique,  
All ports in Guadeloupe,  
St. Jago de Cuba,  
Ports in the East Indies, Tonquin, and Cochin China,  
Trieste,  
All Egyptian ports,  
Ports on the Red Sea,  
Rio de Janeiro, and Havana.

The prohibition of the importation into the Kingdom of dirty linen, worn clothes, and used bed clothes, in so far as the aforesaid articles do not form part of the luggage of travellers, rags, used wadding, carded wool, waste paper, hair, and hides, is in force with respect to the following places:—

Sicilian ports,  
Ports on the French coast between Nantes and St. Malo, both inclusive,  
Egersund,  
All ports in Florida,  
All ports in Jamaica,  
All ports in Martinique,  
All ports in Guadeloupe,  
St. Jago de Cuba,

All ports in the East Indies, Tonquin, and Cochin China, and

All ports in Chili.

The prohibition of the importation into the kingdom of dirty linen, worn clothes, and used bed clothes, in so far as these articles do not form part of the luggage of travellers, is in force with regard to Rio de Janeiro and Havana. The public cleansing of linen, clothes, and bed clothes brought as luggage from either of the two aforesaid places is also particularly enjoined.

The provisions contained in this notice come into force at once (November 2).

EASTERN ARCHIPELAGO.—JAVA—SAPUDI STRAIT.

*Sapudi Island Light—Limits of Visibility.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 11 (2) of 14th January, 1888, on the exhibition of a light on the western point of Sapudi Island, Sapudi Strait:—

The Government of Batavia has given further notice, dated 19th September, 1888, that the light (fixed white) is obscured by the land of Sapudi Island from the bearing of S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. to N.W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  N.

vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle, as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed, so as not to obstruct the car.

Bankrupt had omitted to keep such books of account as are usual and proper in the business carried on by him, and as sufficiently disclose his business transactions and financial position within the three years immediately preceding his bankruptcy; had continued to trade after knowing himself to be insolvent; had contracted debts provable in the bankruptcy without having at the time of contracting them any reasonable grounds of expectation of being able to pay them; and had been guilty of fraud or fraudulent breach of trust
